

## **Brief Bio**

Leon D. Caldwell, Ph.D. is an Assistant Professor of Educational Psychology at the University of Nebraska, Lincoln (UNL). He received his Ph.D. in Counseling Psychology from Penn State University (1998). Dr. Caldwell has a M. Ed. in Secondary School Counseling and a B.A. in Economics from Lehigh University. Before being appointed as the Assistant Executive Director for Internal Affairs of the National Black Graduate Association he served as the Northeast Regional representative covering a 7 state region. Dr. Caldwell has spoke across the country on the issue of Black student empowerment, the need for campus coalition building, and strategies for recruitment, retention, and self preservation on predominantly White campuses. His research and publication interest are in the areas of Black psychology, career counseling, mental health service delivery to under served populations, and school counseling. He coordinates a study abroad course in Ghana, West Africa. As a native of West Philadelphia, a former Division I student -athlete, and success of a mother headed home he believes that opportunity and access must be met with preparation.
