Cops in the Community



To prevent yourself from becoming a victim:

- Remove all valuables from your car at night.
- Garage your vehicles if you can and shut your garage doors!
- If your vehicle must be left outside, lock all doors and roll up windows.
- Increase outside lighting.
- Never leave a key inside your vehicle.



Bike Trail Safety

1. Tell someone your route before you leave.
2. Lock your vehicle and roll up windows if parked at a trailhead.
3. Wear visible clothing or a light if you are exercising at night.
4. Pay attention to your surroundings!
