

ORDINANCE NO. _____

1 AN ORDINANCE amending Section 24.52.010 of the Lincoln Municipal Code
2 relating to sewer connection fees to provide for a connection fee reimbursement to a party who
3 has constructed a city sewer pursuant to the executive order process authorized by Section
4 26.11.038; and repealing Section 24.52.010 of the Lincoln Municipal Code as hitherto existing.

5 BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:

6 Section 1. That Section 24.52.010 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended
7 to read as follows:

8 **24.52.010 Sewer Connection Fee.**

9 Whenever the owner of any property desires to connect the same with a city sewer and
10 the cost of the sewer or a portion thereof has been paid by the City of Lincoln or an abutting
11 property owner or subdivider pursuant to the executive order process authorized by Lincoln
12 Municipal Code Section 26.11.038, and no part of the cost of which has been assessed against
13 the property sought to be connected with the city sewer, the owner of the property sought to be
14 connected shall be required to pay to the City of Lincoln a connection fee equivalent to the cost
15 of the construction of the city sewer as it pertains to such property or to an assessment had the
16 property been assessed for such construction in accordance with city standards. When the
17 sewer has been constructed pursuant to the executive order process at no cost to the City, the
18 connection fee paid to the City as provided herein shall in turn be paid by the City to the
19 permittee who constructed the city sewer and who thereby paid the cost of construction.

20 Section 2. That Section 24.52.010 of the Lincoln Municipal Code as hitherto
21 existing be and the same is hereby repealed.

1 Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its
2 passage and publication according to law.
