

RESOLUTION NO. A- \_\_\_\_\_

1 WHEREAS, the City Council is authorized, pursuant to Section 8.32.100 of the Lincoln  
2 Municipal Code, to establish or revise, by resolution, fees to be charged to any person for the  
3 privilege of using any public landfill or other waste disposal facility owned by the City, and;

4 WHEREAS, the City Council deems it necessary to revise the fees for use of the City's  
5 sanitary landfill as last revised by Resolution No. A-79667 passed by the City Council on August  
6 23, 1999;

7 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln,  
8 Nebraska:

9 That effective June 1, 2003, the following schedules of landfill use charges are hereby  
10 established and adopted:

11 SCHEDULE A – Small Vehicles

12 The following rates shall be applied to all private and public vehicles including pickup  
13 trucks or trailers having nominal box dimensions (carrying capacity) of 6' x 8' (width or length) x  
14 5' height (9 cubic yards) or smaller; using the small vehicle transfer station, or yard waste  
15 composting site and shall apply to all waste types:

16	Cars per vehicle trip . . . . .	\$2.50
17	Cars with trailers, pickups, vans, or trailers only per vehicle trip . . . . .	\$10.00
18	Pickups with trailers per vehicle trip . . . . .	\$16.00

19 The following rate shall be applied to all small vehicles including cars, pickups,  
20 vans, and trailers using the construction and demolition debris landfill . . . \$4.00

21 Any uncovered load will be assessed an additional fee of \$3.00 per uncovered vehicle.

22 SCHEDULE B – Refuse Trucks and Trailers

1 Refuse trucks and trailers shall be defined as all trucks one-ton rated and larger and all  
2 multiple-axle trailers, hauling solid refuse, building rubbish or demolition debris containing 50%  
3 or more of combustible material to the sanitary landfill. The following rate shall be applied to all  
4 refuse trucks and trailers rate on a load weight basis as follows:

5 ~~\$17.00~~ \$10.00 Per Ton

6 For periods that the scale is inoperative, the rate charged for refuse trucks and trailers  
7 shall be ~~\$6.00~~ \$3.25 per cubic yard for compacted and non-compacted refuse. ~~The Director of~~  
8 ~~Public Works & Utilities may establish a volume and weight relationship-based fee for non-~~  
9 ~~compacted waste when the scale is inoperative. The charge for refuse trucks and trailers~~  
10 ~~weighting up to one ton (net weight) shall be a flat fee of \$12.75. The minimum charge for~~  
11 refuse trucks and trailers shall be \$8.00. Any uncovered load will be assessed an additional  
12 amount equal to 50% of the computed charge for such load. The minimum fee for uncovered  
13 loads shall be \$50.00.

#### 14 SCHEDULE C – Yard Waste Trucks

15 Yard waste trucks and trailers shall be defined as all vehicles hauling yard waste  
16 (including all commercial lawn haulers regardless of vehicle type) to the City-owned composting  
17 site. The following rate shall be applied to all yard waste trucks and trailers on a load weight  
18 basis as follows:

19 \$15.75 Per Ton

20 For periods that the scale is inoperative, the rate charged for yard waste trucks and trailers  
21 shall be \$8.00 per cubic yard. ~~The charge for yard waste trucks and trailers weighing up to one~~  
22 ~~ton (net weight) shall be a flat fee of \$12.75. The minimum charge for yard waste trucks and~~  
23 trailers shall be \$11.00. Any uncovered load will be assessed an additional amount equal to 50%  
24 of the computed charge for such load. The minimum fee for uncovered loads shall be \$50.00.

1 SCHEDULE D – Demolition Debris

2 Demolition debris, which shall be accepted at the City’s separate designated disposal site,  
3 shall be limited to demolition debris as defined by Municipal Code 8.32.010 which has less than  
4 50% combustible demolition debris material in each load. The following rate shall be applied to  
5 all vehicles disposing of demolition debris at the City designated construction and demolition  
6 debris disposal site on a load weight basis:

7 \$4.00 Per Ton

8 For periods that the scale is inoperative, the rate charged for disposal of demolition debris  
9 shall be \$4.00 per cubic yard as determined through visual observation by City staff. The charge  
10 for disposal of demolition debris for loads weighing up to one ton (net weight) shall be a flat fee  
11 of \$4.00 per vehicle.

12 SCHEDULE E – Special Fees

13 The following special fee rate schedule shall apply to Special Wastes, tires, appliances, or  
14 unacceptable wastes which are rejected from landfill disposal. The special fee schedule shall be  
15 as follows:

- 16 1. Special Wastes as defined by Municipal Code 8.32.080
- 17 1a. Special Wastes landfilled directly with other refuse at time  
18 of disposal . . . . . ~~\$17.00~~ \$10.00 per ton plus  
19 \$5.00 per load (permit) fee
- 20 Minimum Charge . . . . . ~~\$22.00~~ \$15.00
- 21 1b. Special Wastes requiring segregation from other refuse  
22 at time of disposal (including, but not limited to,  
23 asbestos containing materials) . . . . . ~~\$17.00~~ \$10.00 per ton plus  
24 \$25.00 per load special handling fee
- 25 Minimum Charge . . . . . ~~\$42.00~~ \$35.00
- 26 1c. Small vehicles with Special Wastes . . . . . Applicable fees in Schedule A

1 plus \$5.00 per load (permit)

2 2. All whole and processed tires (portions of tires)

3 2a. Individual loads of 10 or more whole or processed tires shall not be  
4 accepted at the City’s disposal site(s).

5 2b. Individual loads of less than 10 whole or processed tires shall be  
6 accepted at the City’s disposal site(s) and shall be placed in appropriate  
7 areas for recycling as directed. All whole or processed tires shall be  
8 prohibited from landfill disposal. The following special fees shall  
9 apply to whole or processed tires when accepted at the City’s disposal  
10 site(s).

11 i. Car passenger tire or light truck tire ..... \$3.00 each  
12 plus applicable Schedule A fees

13 ii. Heavy (over-the-road) truck tire ..... \$6.50 each  
14 plus applicable Schedule A fees

15 iii. Farm or industrial (off-road) tire ..... \$11.50 each  
16 plus applicable Schedule A fees

17 3. Appliances, including but not limited to, water softeners, heaters, dishwashers,  
18 refrigerators, freezers, washing machines, clothes dryers, air conditioners, etc.;  
19 shall be accepted at the City’s disposal site(s) and shall be placed in appropriate  
20 areas for recycling as directed. All appliances shall be prohibited from landfill  
21 disposal. The following special fee shall apply to all appliances.

22 Appliances ..... \$5.00 each  
23 plus applicable Schedule A fees

24 4. Wastes which are unacceptable or prohibited from landfill disposal, including but  
25 not limited to out-of-county wastes, hazardous wastes, non-permitted special  
26 wastes, yard wastes, tires, appliances, waste oil and lead acid batteries, and are  
27 found to exist in a waste load and are subsequently rejected from landfill disposal  
28 and the hauler fails to remove the waste or place the waste in the designated areas  
29 the following special fee will be assessed. This will in no way relieve the hauler  
30 from any other liability or responsibilities for unacceptable or prohibited waste  
31 left at the City’s facilities:

32 Unacceptable waste loads rejected from  
33 landfill disposal ..... \$50.00 per occurrence

34 Any uncovered load will be assessed an additional amount equal to 50% of the computed

1 charge for such load. The minimum for uncovered loads shall be \$50.00.

2 The Director of Public Works & Utilities shall have the authority to negotiate for and  
3 collect fees on any wastes that may require unusual or special handling considerations other than  
4 those wastes addressed herein. The Director of Public Works & Utilities shall have the authority  
5 to issue rules and regulations which further define vehicle types, uncovered loads, and other  
6 policies for the City's solid waste disposal facilities and operations.

7 The Mayor shall have the authority to waive all or any portion of the scheduled fees in the  
8 event of severe weather, emergency, or disaster which creates the need for immediate disposal of  
9 debris, refuse, rubble, etc. resulting from such emergency.

10 That Resolution No. A-79667 as hitherto existing is hereby repealed.
