

MOTION TO AMEND NO. 1

I hereby move to amend Bill No. 10-107 as follows:

1. On Page 2, between Lines 4 and 5, insert the following:

“(f) By October 1, 2011, the Internal Liquor Committee, created pursuant to Resolution A-75247, shall create a mandatory responsible beverage service training permit and training course whereby all persons who sell or serve liquor at retail will be educated in responsible beverage service practices and applicable laws.”

2. On Page 2, Line 10, strike “September 10, 2010” and insert in lieu thereof “September 17, 2010.”

Reason for Request: The City of Lincoln recognizes the need for uniform training among the industry and has been successful in reducing liquor-related issues through training of owners/managers. Many licensees have expressed the need for their employees to be trained in responsible beverage service. The University of Nebraska and the Nebraska Liquor Control Commission have already created a basic on-line responsible beverage service training course for all persons who sell or serve liquor at retail. In order to serve food or liquor, an employee must have a current food permit. The Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department (LLCHD) provides an on-line training course for all food permits. The current idea is to create a “one-stop shop” for these employees. The employee would access LLCHD’s website, log-in, and be able to take the responsible beverage service training course. LLCHD’s website allows the employee to elect which courses they wish to take, pay for the applicable permits on-line, and print the permits.
