- + Child care facility inspections were lower the last two years due to the elimination of 0.5 FTE in the EPH Division in FY 2001-2002
- ◆ Child Care Referrals - Over the past two years the number of parents calling Child Care Connection has decreased significantly. At the same time, the number of visits on the Child Care Connection web site has increased dramatically, with an average month having between 700 and 900 visits.
- Water well permits fluctuate every other year due to a biannual well permit for wells within the City limits.
- ◆ Public health nuisances investigated. Due to the City Council's elimination of 1.0 FTE in the budget in FY 2003, the number of complaints investigated was much lower.
- Tremendous media attention to the potential health effects of molds in homes and businesses led to a 35% increase in phone consultations on indoor air quality.
