Pharmaceutical and Personal Care Products in Drinking Water Supplies Seminar

The Groundwater Foundation's goal in this project is to empower people through education and prevention ideas to help communities protect their drinking water from pharmaceutical and personal care product (PPCP) contamination through a series of seminars held in Nebraska during 2007.

PPCPs In Drinking Water: Potential Risks & Best Practices Seminars
Pharmaceuticals and personal care products are a diverse group of chemicals including all human and veterinary drugs, dietary supplements, and other consumer products. They are introduced into the environment in a variety of ways. One way is through wastewater treatment systems, which generally do not treat for these products. As a result, pharmaceuticals and personal care products that are flushed may enter our drinking water supplies.



In response to recent concerns about traces of pharmaceutical and personal care products found in drinking water across the United States, the Nebraska Pharmacists Association has partnered with the Groundwater Foundation, the Nebraska Department of Environmental Quality, the Nebraska Board of Pharmacy, and the Lincoln-Lancaster County Health Department to create the Nebraska MEDS (Medication Education on Disposal Strategies) Program. The focus of Nebraska MEDS program is to educate patients about proper disposal of prescription and over-the-counter medications.

Don't Flush Unwanted Medications

If flushed down the drain, unneeded or expired medications can contaminate our water. In 2002, the United States Geological Survey (USGS) released a study that detailed very low concentrations of medications in 80% of 139 waterways across the country. Seven streams and groundwater samples in Nebraska were included in this study. Nonprescription drugs like acetaminophen were found most frequently. Less commonly found were prescription drugs such as antibiotics, hormones and even antidepressants.

Check Your Medicine Cabinet

Individuals and families are all likely to find a variety of unused, expired and unneeded medications in their homes. Any left-over medications should be disposed of properly for the following reasons:

- It is UNSAFE to reuse medications. If a person thinks a prescription medication is needed, they should contact a doctor.
- Unused medications are often INEFFECTIVE because they have been kept past their expiration date or they have been stored









SMART DISPOSAL™

A Prescription for a Healthy Planet

- DO NOT FLUSH unused medications and DO NOT POUR them down a sink or drain.
- To ensure protection of people and pets:
 - a) Pour medication into a sealable plastic bag. If medication is a solid, crush it or add water to dissolve it.
 - b) Add kitty litter, sawdust, coffee grounds, or a similar material to the plastic bag.
 - c) Seal the plastic bag and dispose of it in the trash.




for Disposal Strategies

- DO NOT FLUSH unused medications and DO NOT POUR them down a sink or drain.
- To ensure protection of people and pets, follow all these steps:
 1. pour medication into a sealable plastic bag. If medication is a solid, crush it or add water to dissolve it, then
 2. add cat litter, sawdust, coffee grounds, or a similar material to the plastic bag, and
 3. seal the plastic bag and dispose of it in the trash.

Protect Your Family & Pets



Any left over medications should be disposed of properly for the following reasons:

- ✓ It is UNSAFE to reuse medications. If a person thinks a prescription medication is needed, they should contact a doctor.
- ✓ Unused medications are often INEFFECTIVE because they have been kept past their expiration date or they have been stored improperly.
- ✓ Unused medications can make a person's home the target of BURGLARY OR THEFT by drug abusers.
- ✓ Discarded medications can be found and ingested by children or pets, resulting in accidental POISONING.



Tracks the AC electricity coming from and being sent back to the electric utility grid


