Summer Break Safety

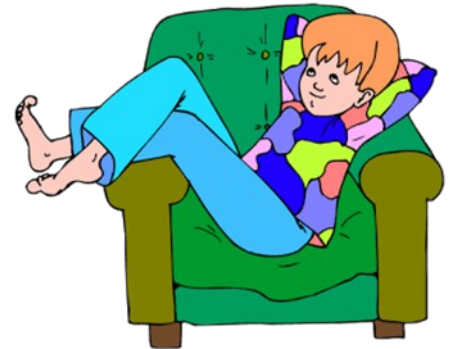
Summer is here! Everyone gets excited for the summer, but it is also a time when children spend more time alone at home and online. It is best to speak to children about expectations at the beginning of summer and go over safety plans in the event of an emergency.

At Home:

- Keep the doors locked and the blinds shut.
- Do not answer the phone if Mom and Dad are not home.
- Do not invite people over when Mom and Dad aren't there.
- Do not tell anyone if you are home alone.
- Have a plan! Where to go, who to call, if there is an emergency.

On the Internet:

- Never post personal information online such as phone number, address, etc.
- Never purchase anything without parents' permission.
- Never share passwords with anyone- except parents.
- Never reply to junk mail.
- Call the police if someone threatens harm to you, themselves or someone else.
- Call the police if someone threatens to commit a crime.
- Call the police if someone posts your private information online.

Since the beginning of June, there have been 24 reported residential burglaries in Lincoln. Burglaries are difficult cases because there is usually no surveillance video available to assist officers in developing suspects. We recommend keeping good records of your belongings. In the unfortunate event your home is victimized, serial numbers will assist the officers in getting your items back.

A great way to keep track of your belongings is to sign up at www.knowyourstuff.org. This is a FREE, convenient way to keep track of your belongings and serial numbers. Use your smartphone, tablet or desktop/laptop to easily create and manage inventories and download reports to any mobile device or computer! It even allows you to upload photos of items and requires minimal personal information upon sign-up.
