Project Summary

The City of Lincoln Public Works and Utilities Watershed Department and the City of Lincoln Parks and Recreation Department are planning improvements to Tyrrell Park. The project aims to improve stormwater quality, reduce stormwater flow velocities, reduce potential flooding threats to adjacent properties, and provide environmental education opportunities for Mickle Middle School and the general public. The project area includes the west side of Tyrrell Park, directly north of Mickle Middle School.

The design includes several features and proposed improvements to improve stormwater quality. Stormwater management practices to be installed include a grass channel in place of the existing concrete lined channel, infiltration basins that detain and infiltrate stormwater, infiltration terraces, permeable pavers in the north parking lot, pervious pavement in the south parking lot, and various native plantings. The design also includes a new walking trail through the park with educational exhibits that feature native plantings, infiltration basins, examples of different regional stone, and educational signs.

The City's intention is to gather feedback at the open house, then finish the design and construct the project this summer.
