





The following is a construction update for three City of Lincoln Transportation and Utilities projects in your area

48TH FROM LEIGHTON TO SUPERIOR STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Improvements for this Lincoln on the Move project are being completed in segments. Segments 1 through 4 are currently closed with local access only, via adjacent streets.

Latest News:

- Segment 1: Cornhusker Highway to Superior Street is anticipated to open in early summer 2023.
- Segment 2: Gladstone Street to Cornhusker Highway will remain open to local traffic only, after area construction is anticipated to be complete in mid-summer 2023.
- Segment 3: Adams Street to Gladstone Street is anticipated to open in fall 2023.
- Segment 4: Madison Avenue to Adams Street is anticipated to open in late summer 2023, prior to the start of the school year.
- Segment 5: Leighton Avenue to Madison Avenue construction will begin later this summer under full closure with local access only, via adjacent streets.

48TH FROM LEIGHTON TO GLADSTONE WATER MAIN PROJECT

Improvements for this project are being completed in segments and in coordination with street improvements along the project corridor. Segment 1 is currently closed with local access only, via adjacent street

Latest News

- Segment 1: Madison Avenue to Gladstone Street is anticipated to open in coordination with Segments 3 and 4 of the street improvement project.
- Segment 2: Leighton Avenue to Madison Avenue construction will be in coordination with Segment 5 of the street improvement project and will begin later this summer under full closure with local access only, via adjacent streets.

UNIVERSITY PLACE NEIGHBORHOOD STREET IMPROVEMENTS

Construction of improvements will begin in early summer under full closure of individual streets while work is completed in the area. Local access to individual properties will be maintained.
