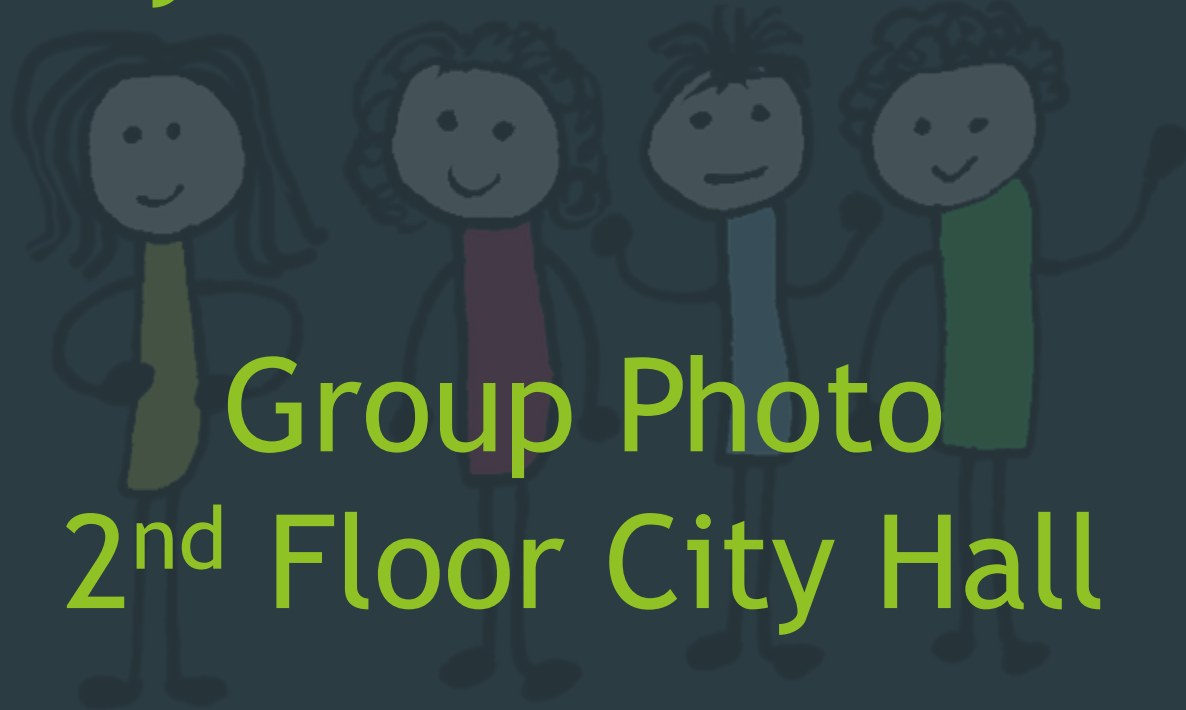

- *Provide an additional level of oversight, collaboration and advocacy regarding transportation infrastructure investments that are funded by the additional quarter of one percent sales tax.*

From the voter-approved ballot language:

- *The street projects funded by the additional quarter of one percent sales tax shall be determined by the City's Capital Improvement Program with the guidance of a citizen oversight committee appointed by the Mayor to ensure that these tax revenues are spent fairly, efficiently, effectively, and in all quadrants of the City.*

UPLNK is a free app hosted on the SeeClickFix platform, where you can report:

- Streetlight problems
- Downed tree limbs
- Potholes
- Park maintenance issues

UPLNK helps streamline our practices by sending appropriate request directly to our work order system, which is then sent to crews. When the issue is completed, the original requestor is notified.



LINCOLN, Neb. (KOLN/LTU) - Lincoln Transportation and Utilities says sections of 40th Street that have been under construction since May 1 are now open in the far southern part of the city.

"The openings are part of phase one of the project," LTU said in a press release. "Those sections include the 40th Street and Hill intersection, Yankee Hill to Wilderness Hills Boulevard, and newly constructed right turn lanes from Yankee Hill onto 40th for north and southbound traffic."

The departments says phase two of the project should be completed next summer, which is 40th from Wilderness Hills to that stretch of road remains closed as a result of the ongoing construction.

"The Wilderness Hills Boulevard roundabout is open for north, west, and eastbound travel," LTU added. "Southbound travel is available from Yankee Hill to Wilderness Hills where phase two construction continues."

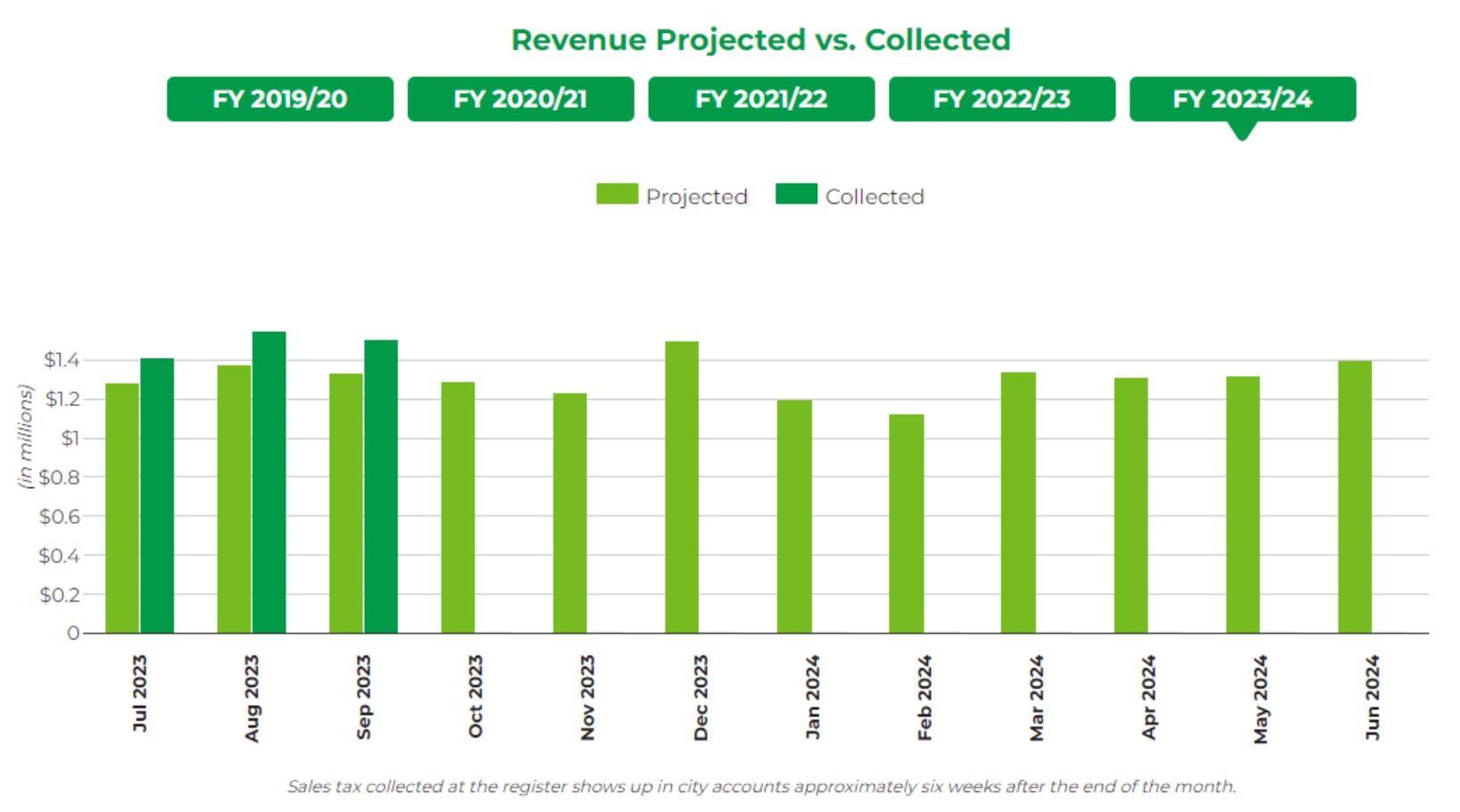

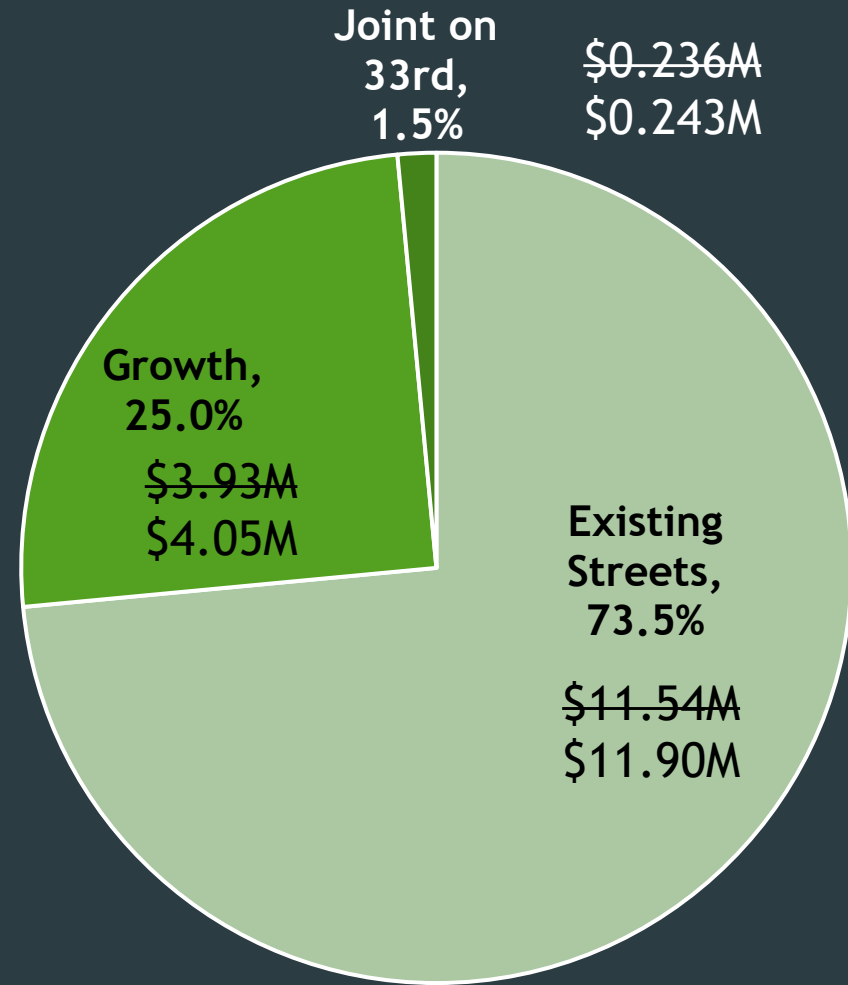

- ▶ Through November 2023, collections exceed projections by about \$0.5M

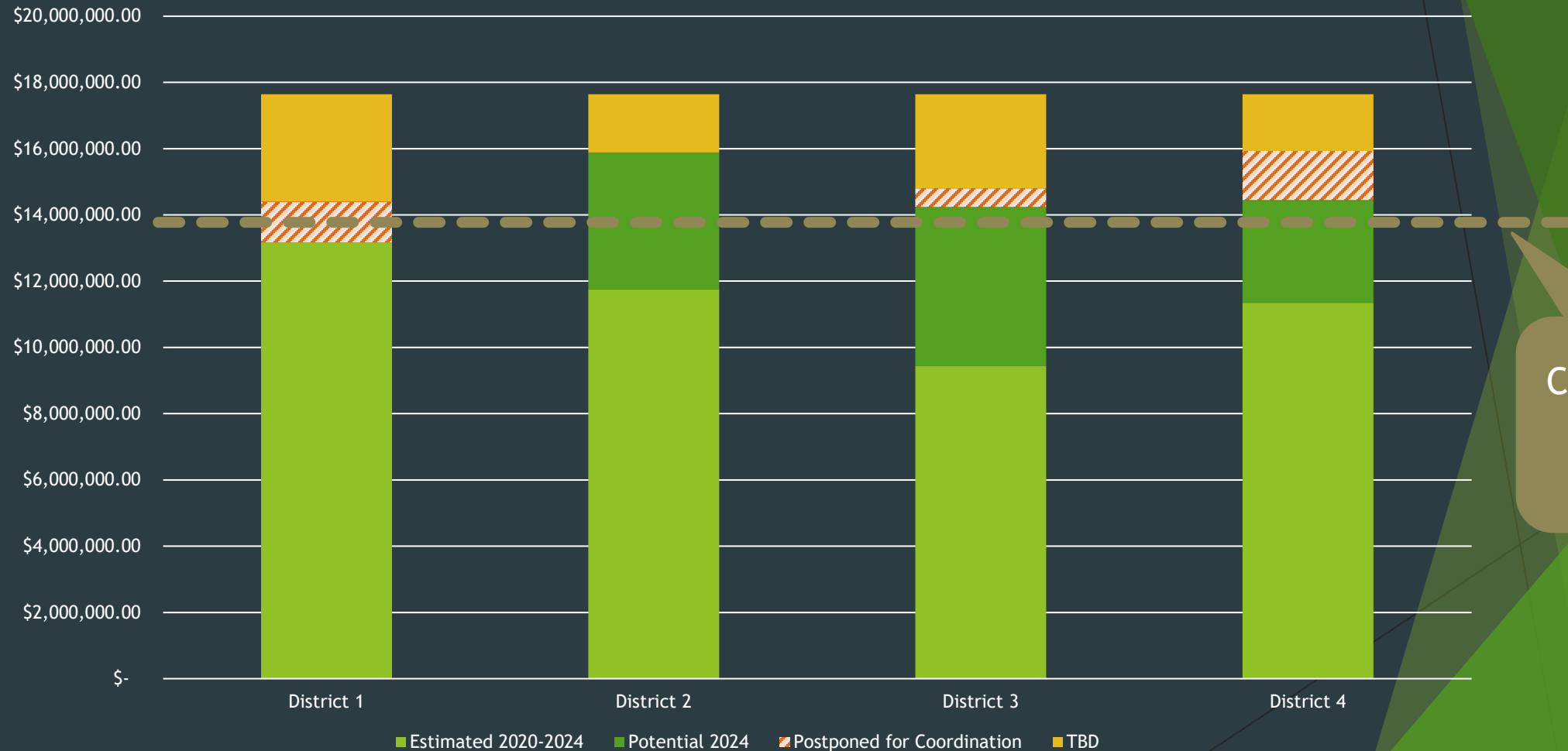
