**A New “O” Street Awaits!** The City is preparing for the first major reinvestment in Lincoln's downtown main street in nearly 50 years. Improvements will replace aging infrastructure and enhance public spaces downtown. Here's what you can expect:

- **IMPROVED INFRASTRUCTURE:** New water mains, removal of lead service lines, smoother streets, upgraded sidewalks and safer crossings.
- **BETTER PUBLIC SPACES:** Enhanced lighting, landscaping, and public amenities that support shopping, dining, festivals, and foot traffic.

The project team will be on hand to share information and answer questions about the project and plans for construction set to begin in early 2026. Attendees are invited to stop in at any time during the open house. No formal presentation is planned.
