



Street improvements are coming to your neighborhood!

Work is scheduled to begin on street improvements within your neighborhood. These improvements are funded by City of Lincoln tax dollars. **There will be no additional cost to you.**



Parking Your Vehicle

The work may require temporary closure of the roadway and/or your driveway. It may be necessary to park your car on an adjacent street for part of the construction period. Local access will be maintained as much as possible. Look for "Temporary No Parking" signs indicating when work will be starting. If special accommodations are needed, we are happy to assist as best we can.



Project Completion

Weather and other factors may affect the completion timeframe of the project, however work is usually completed within a month from beginning construction at a location. The work involved with this project will be reconstructing sidewalk handicap ramps, performing curb and gutter repairs, and milling and overlaying the asphalt roadway.





Additional Information

Please remind children to stay away from work zone areas. Public safety agencies have been informed of the project.

In some cases, sidewalks, driveways, curbs and gutters within the City Right of Way will be impacted and grass areas may be damaged. The contractor will reseed, but property owners are encouraged to water impacted areas. Property owners should also try to mark areas and locations of underground sprinkler systems prior to construction.

Paint Marks and Flag Markings

You may notice paint marks and flags being placed within the City Right of Way and/or on streets and sidewalks. These markings are color coded for underground utilities and locations of street and sidewalk improvements. In most cases, the paint markings indicate the following chart below:

 White - Proposed Excavation	 Orange - Communication/Alarm/Signal
 Pink - Temporary Survey Markings	 Blue - Potable Water
 Red - Electric Power Lines/Cables/Conduit	 Purple - Reclaimed Water/Irrigation
 Yellow - Gas, Oil, Steam	 Green - Sewer/Drain Lines
