ORDINANCE NO. ____

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AN ORDINANCE repealing Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.14.270 Speed Contests; amending Section 10.20.010 Race Track Defined to "General Definitions" to provide definitions for race track and racing; amending Section 10.20.020 Race Track Prohibited to "Racing Prohibited" providing that racing or participating in any race on any street or highway in the city, on any public or private parking lot, or at any park, cemetery or other public or private property within the city, or property owned by the city shall be unlawful; amending Section 10.20.030 Participation Prohibited to "Race Tracks Prohibited" providing that no person shall operate or sponsor a race track for motor vehicles within the city except when approved by a permitted special use or permitted by the city; repealing Section 10.20.040 Exceptions as this language was moved to Section 10.20.030; amending Section 10.20.050 Racing on Parking Lots Prohibited to "Penalty" to state the penalties for violating any provisions of Chapter 10.20; repealing Section 10.20.060 Racing on Park and Other Property Prohibited as this language was moved to Section 10.20.020; repealing Section 10.20.070 Penalty for Violations as this language was amended and moved to Section 10.20.050; by amending Title 10 to create a new chapter 10.43 entitled "Nuisance Vehicles" to include a new section numbered 10.43.010 entitled "Suppression of Nuisances; Disorderly Vehicles" to provide that any motor vehicle in violation of the ordinances of the city will be declared a disorderly vehicle and a public nuisance and a new section numbered 10.43.020 entitled "Disorderly Vehicles, Impoundment" to provide that a motor vehicle in violation of city ordinances and Nebraska Statutes that is declared a disorderly vehicle and a public nuisance may

1	be subject to impoundment; and repealing sections 10.20.010, 10.20.020, 10.20.030, and
2	10.20.050 as hitherto existing.
3	BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Lincoln, Nebraska:
4	Section 1. That Section 10.14.270 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be and the same is
5	hereby repealed.
6	10.14.270 Speed Contests.
7	a.— It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in or participate in any motor vehicle speed contest
8	or exhibition of speed upon the streets of the city, including, but not limited to, participation as a
9	starter, timer, lookout, or operator of a motor vehicle.
10	b. It shall be unlawful for any person for the purpose of facilitating or aiding or as an incident to any
11	motor vehicle speed contest upon a street in any manner to obstruct or place a barricade or obstruction
12	upon any street.
13	e. The provisions of this section shall not apply to racing or other motor vehicle exhibitions
14	permitted by the city or sponsored by the city.
15	Section 2. That Section 10.20.010 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended to read
16	as follows:
17	10.20.010 General Definitions Race Track Defined.
18	The following words as used in this Chapter shall have the following meanings:
19	Race track shall mean any premises designed, intended, or used for any competitive event between motor
20	vehicles over a predetermined course or predetermined time or duration; or any premises designed
21	intended, or used for any contest of speed, strength, pulling power, or similar characteristics in which

motor vehicles are operated.

1 Racing shall mean the use of one or more vehicles in a speed competition or contest in an attempt to 2 outgain or outdistance another vehicle, to prevent another vehicle from passing, to arrive at a given 3 destination ahead of another vehicle or vehicles, to show an exhibition of speed or acceleration, or to test 4 the physical stamina or endurance of drivers over long-distance driving routes. 5 Section 3. That Section 10.20.020 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended to read 6 as follows: 7 10.20.020 Race TrackRacing Prohibited. 8 It shall be unlawful for any person to operate or to sponsor a race track within the city for any motor 9 vehicles in any race, speed or acceleration contest, test of physical endurance, or exhibition of speed or 10 acceleration or for the purpose of making a speed record, or to in any manner participate in any such race, 11 competition, contest, test, or exhibition including, but not limited to, participation as a starter, timer, 12 spectator, or lookout: 13 on any street or highway in the city; 14 at any public or private parking lot open to public use; 15 at any park, cemetery, grounds or other similar public or private property in the city open 16 to public use, or on property outside the corporate limits owned or operated by the city-17 except as permitted by Section 10.20.040. 18 Section 4. That Section 10.20.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended to read 19 as follows: 20 10.20.030 Participation Race Tracks Prohibited. 21 No person shall operate or sponsor a race track for motor vehicles within the city or participate in, a race, 22 or operate a motor vehicle upon a race track, except where approved as permitted special uses in the AG

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2	when permitted by the city or sponsored by the city on property owned or operated by the city.
3	It shall be unlawful for any person to participate in, race or operate a motor vehicle upon, or take part in
4	the operation of a race track within the city for motor vehicles.
5	Section 5. That Section 10.20.040 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be and the same is
6	hereby repealed.
7	10.20.040 Exceptions .
8	The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to:
9	a. Race tracks for motor vehicles that are approved as permitted special uses in the AG and I-1 zoning
10	districts as allowed by Sections 27.07.040 and 27.47.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code.
11	b. Motor vehicle racing or other exhibitions of motor vehicles permitted by the city or sponsored by the
12	city on property owned or operated by the city.
13	Section 6. That Section 10.20.050 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended to read
14	as follows:
15	10.20.050 PenaltyRacing on Parking Lots Prohibited.
16	Any person violating any of the provisions of this Chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and
17	upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or by imprisonment in the
18	county jail for a period not to exceed six months, or both. Any vehicle used in violation of this Chapter
19	may be impounded pursuant to Chapter 10.43. The penalty herein provided shall be cumulative with and
20	in addition to the revocation, cancellation, or forfeiture of any license, permit, or right elsewhere in this
21	Title, the seizure of any vehicle operated in violation of this Title, or as provided by law.
22	It shall be unlawful for any person to race any motor vehicle on any public or private parking lot, or on

and I-1 zoning districts as allowed by Sections 27.07.040 and 27.47.030 of the Lincoln Municipal Code or

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any other similar property within the city.

1	Section 7. That Section 10.20.060 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be and is hereby
2	repealed.
3	10.20.060 Racing on Park and Other Property Prohibited.
4	It shall be unlawful for any person to race any motor vehicle within any park, cemetery, grounds, or any
5	other similar public or private property in the city open to public use, or on property outside the corporate
6	limits owned or operated by the city.
7	Section 8. That Section 10.20.070 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be and is hereby
8	repealed.
9	10.20.070 Penalty for Violations.
10	Any person upon whom a duty is placed by the provisions of this chapter, who shall fail, neglect, or refuse
11	to perform such duty, or who shall violate any of the provisions hereof, shall be deemed guilty of a
12	misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a
13	period not to exceed six months or a fine not to exceed \$100.00 recoverable with costs, or both. Each day
14	that a violation of this chapter continues shall be punishable as such. The penalty herein provided shall be
15	cumulative with and in addition to the revocation, cancellation or forfeiture of any license, permit or right
16	elsewhere in the ordinances of the City of Lincoln provided.
17	Section 9. That Title 10 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended by adding a new
18	section numbered 10.43.010 to read as follows:
19	10.43.010 Suppression of Nuisances; Disorderly Vehicles.
20	Any motor vehicle where, in violation of the ordinances of the city, unlawful or illegal acts are committed
21	in use thereof, is hereby declared to be an unreasonable interference with the health, safety, welfare, and
22	property of the citizens of the city, a disorderly vehicle, and a public or common nuisance. Such nuisances
23	may be restrained or suppressed by the city in any manner provided by law. A disorderly vehicle as used

 which, or in which, illegal acts are being committed. It shall be unlawful for the registered or titled owner
 to permit the operation of a disorderly vehicle or vehicles.
- 4 Section 10. That Title 10 of the Lincoln Municipal Code be amended by adding a new section
- 5 numbered 10.43.020 to read as follows:

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- 6 <u>10.43.020 Disorderly Vehicles, Impoundment.</u>
 - 1. A motor vehicle, regardless of the registered or titled ownership, being operated by a person in violation of any of the following: Racing Prohibited in violation of Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.20.020; Race Tracks Prohibited in violation of Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.20.030; Reckless Driving in violation of Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.14.290; Willful Reckless Driving in violation of Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.14.300; Flee in Motor Vehicle to Avoid Arrest in violation of Lincoln Municipal Code Section 10.14.280; or Racing on Highways as set forth in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 60-6,6195; Reckless Driving or Willful Reckless Driving as set forth in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 60-6,6213-6,218; Operate Motor Vehicle to Avoid Arrest as set forth in Neb. Rev. Stat. § 28-905 is hereby declared a public nuisance and disorderly vehicle and may be subject to impoundment pursuant to the terms in this Chapter.
- 17 <u>2. Unless being held as evidence, any motor vehicle impounded under this Section shall be released</u>
 18 <u>under the following conditions:</u>
- a. Immediately to the registered or titled owner of the motor vehicle after the first violation
 committed under this Section.
- b. After ten days to the registered or titled owner of the motor vehicle after the second or
 subsequent violation committed under this Section.

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Any person who, at the direction of a peace officer, tows and stores a motor vehicle pursuant to this 1 2 Section shall have a lien upon such motor vehicle while in his or her possession for reasonable 3 towing and storage charges and shall have a right to retain such motor vehicle until such charges are 4 paid. 5 If the registered or titled owner of a motor vehicle was not the operator of the motor vehicle whose

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actions caused the motor vehicle to be impounded, the registered or titled owner of the motor vehicle may recover civilly from the operator of the motor vehicle all expenses incurred by reason of the impoundment. In the case of a criminal action, the court may order such operator of the motor vehicle to pay restitution to the registered or titled owner in an amount equal to any expenses

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Section 11. That Sections 10.20.010, 10.20.020, 10.20.030, and 10.20.050 of the

incurred with respect to impoundment.

Lincoln Municipal Code as hitherto existing be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 12. This ordinance shall be published, within fifteen days after the passage hereof, in one issue of a daily or weekly newspaper of general circulation in the City, or posted on the official bulletin board of the City, located on the wall across from the City Clerk's office at 555 S. 10th Street, in lieu and in place of the foregoing newspaper publication with notice of passage and such posting to be given by publication one time in the official newspaper by the City Clerk. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication or after its posting and notice of such posting given by publication as herein and in the City Charter provided.

Proposal to Reduce Dangerous Driving on Lincoln's Streets

What are the issues?

- Lincoln City Council, City Administration, and City Departments regularly receive complaints from residents related to dangerous driving along O street and other high-traffic areas.
- Specific issues include high-speed driving, racing, engine revving, tire squealing, and other reckless maneuvers.
- Data collected since 2020, shows that these dangerous driving activities have contributed to more than 500 nighttime crashes, over 600 injury crashes, and six fatalities on O Street alone.
- These hazardous behaviors threaten public safety, disturb the peace of the community, and impact local businesses.

What is currently being done?

- Lincoln Police continue to patrol and enforce existing traffic laws including the use of overtime enforcement, technological tools, and assistance from the Nebraska State Patrol Air Support Unit.
- City officials and departments have continued to analyze the issues and discuss what additional enforcement tools are needed.

What is being proposed?

- Clarifying the Lincoln Municipal Code so dangerous driving activities are clearly understood, prohibited, and more enforceable. Updated definitions for:
 - Racing: Previously defined as a "speed contest", this has been updated to provide clarity. The new definition is more comprehensive and easier to understand. It includes specific location prohibitions:
 - Any street or highway within the city
 - Any public or private parking lot open to public use
 - Any park, cemetery, grounds, or other similar public or private property open to public use
 - Race Tracks: prohibited unless specifically approved as a special permitted use in specific zoning

- New section defining Disorderly Vehicles and penalties
 - Motor vehicles in violation are declared a **Disorderly Vehicle** and public nuisance.
 - The owners of Disorderly Vehicles can also be cited for allowing their vehicles to be used in such a manner, even if they are not the driver of the vehicle. (Example: parents, guardians, etc)
 - In addition to receiving a citation, drivers committing specific dangerous acts could have their vehicles impounded:
 - Racing, Race Tracks, Reckless or Willful Reckless driving, Fleeing to Avoid Arrest
 - First violation: vehicle is towed to impound lot and can be released to the owner of the vehicle (often parents/guardians) immediately. Tow and impound fees must be paid to the impound lot. Typical fees are: \$57 tow + \$50 admin fee + \$8/day storage. Larger or specialty vehicles could be more.
 - Second violation: vehicle is towed to impound lot and can be released to the owner of the vehicle (often parents/guardians) <u>after ten (10) days.</u> Tow and impound fees must be paid to the impound lot. Typical fees are: \$57 tow + \$50 admin fee + \$8/day storage. Larger or specialty vehicles could be more.
 - NOTE: Officers will continue to have discretion on impounding depending on the specific circumstances.
 - NOTE: The owner may recover civilly, or the court may order restitution if the owner was not the operator of the Disorderly Vehicle.

Summary

We are committed to implementing new policies and ordinances aimed at curbing dangerous driving behaviors along O Street and other major high-traffic areas. Dangerous driving causes not only physical harm but also secondary issues like noise disturbances, trespassing, vandalism, thefts, and assaults. Local businesses report financial losses due to disruptions caused by congregations of cars and crowds on their properties.

These new tools, policies, and consequences, including removing dangerous drivers and their vehicles from the road, support the health and safety of our community and the high quality of life we expect in our Lincoln neighborhoods.

There is a car in the driveway that has not been moved longer than that. The owner is a hoarder. The houses condition is deteriorating; gutters have vegetation growing out of them, painting is peeling, drain spouts are not connected. The siding is falling off in places. One area it is pulled away from the house and animals have been seen entering the second story. Racoons, squirrels and bats have been seen coming and going into the house. Every spring it is necessary to call Building and Safety when yard weeds are shoulder high requiring a bush hog to mow down. I have talked with Jim and he had talked with the owner and according to Jim she told him she would have it sold by 12, 2024. No action has been taken. I am a single, 78 year old retired woman next door and on 2 occasions "suspicious characters" were looking her house over (they walked up my drive to see her backyard). The one

said this would be a perfect place for someone to sneak into to live. The other was looking to mow her yard (with a hand mower he was pulling along). This house is on a busy residential street a block from Irving school and across from Irvingdale park. It certainly is not a safe house to be representative for a family neighborhood. Don't let this house continue to be detrimental to the neighborhood area, especially since our taxes have been raised exponentially.

	Thanks for your service, Council Members, Please take a moment to address a potential hazardous property that has fallen into dilapidation over the decade and abandon for the last 3 years. 5 b.25R-80 Assessing fees and penalties for neglected building on the property 1859 Van Dorn Street is on the docket. While Julie Ott has owned the residence since January of 1995, over the last decade or more the property has fallen into disrepair to the degree of potential community health hazards. Evidence of hoarding is present with stacked bins on the porches, no exterior upkeep, the exterior has deteriorated to the point that holes in structure due to the siding that has fallen off are evident. Rodents and bats have been entering the house for several years causing unsanitary conditions. It is clear the
	inside is just as packed as the outside porches as can be seen through the windows.

Your comment

Recently, more people who appear to be shelterless as they are carrying their belongings ask me if the house is abandoned and if I have work for them stating they are about to be evicted. Just yesterday I had a request. The residence is within a block of Irving School. The walkway has not cleared of tree or snow debris for years. Many children use the walkway daily to get to school or the park. The owner, I am told, lives in Gordon, NE. While a black Chevy is parked in the driveway and hasn't moved in a year. The fines are a short term stop gap to a dilapidated structure that is unsafe, the condition of an unsanitary house in a school zone with potential squatters who are interested in a residence is at issue. Rather than fines. the place needs to either be cleaned up and sold or it is at the point where, for structural and community health reasons, it needs to be condemned. The absent, irresponsible owner needs to be accountable to her neighbors and her community. Neighbor, Pat Kempkes is 78 years old living alone next door to a dump. The condition of 1859 Van Dorn affects the value of the houses in the area. Please hold Julie accountable for the maintenance of what once was a really nice home. Again, thank you for your service,
