Per Administrative Regulation 35, the Planning Department is to provide a Complete Streets Annual Report outlining progress made towards implementing the Complete Streets policy.

Over Fiscal Year 2024, the Complete Streets Committee met on September 27, 2023, March 14, 2024, and June 13, 2024. The Subcommittee met on October 24, 2023, January 23, 2024, February 27, 2024, April 23, 2024, and May 27, 2024. The focus of Complete Streets efforts are on Lincoln’s Vision Zero Action Plan, the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Update, the Lincoln Mobility Plan, and the 2050 Comprehensive Plan Update. These work efforts will continue to work with and engage the Complete Streets Committee members.

### Topics Discussed with the Full Committee and Subcommittee

- Public Engagement and Education as a Priority Item.
- Demonstration and Quick Build Project Guide for Lincoln – Internal resource for implementing short-term, low-cost solutions to create safe and welcoming environments for walking and bicycling.
- Partner on Future Trail/Mobility-Oriented Development Discussions – These discussions are planned to take place with the update of the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan, Lincoln Mobility Plan, and minor update of the Lincoln-Lancaster County Comprehensive Plan.

### Projects Using Complete Streets Funding

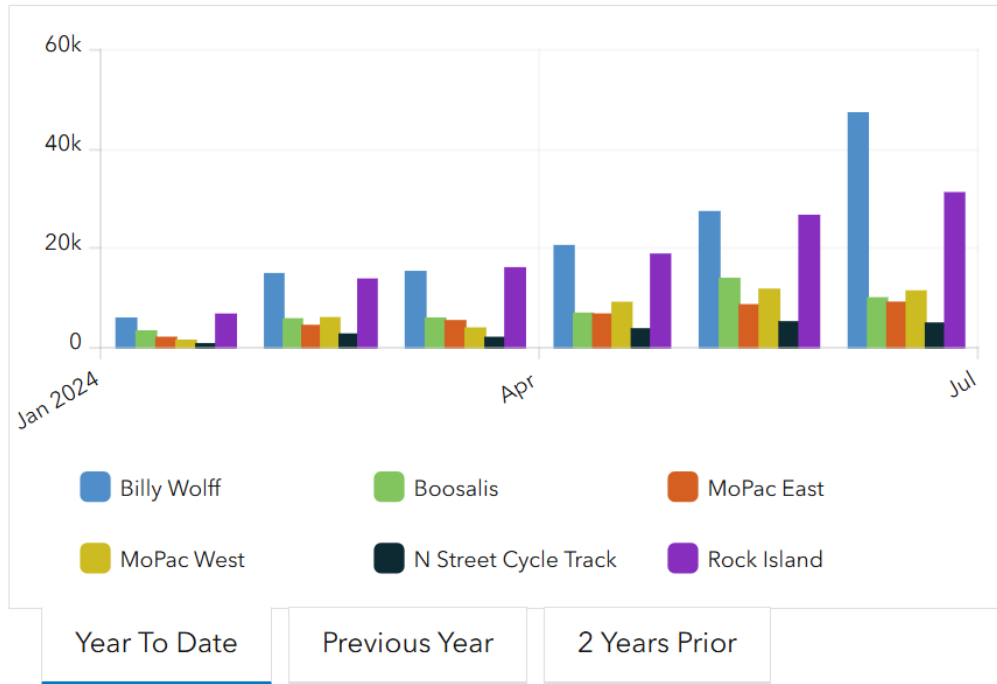

Trail Counter Data Fees	\$2,520	
Bike Rack Request Program	N/A (racks purchased in previous year)	14 new racks installed at seven locations in 2024; six racks pending installation at three City parks plus four to five racks at two additional locations
B Street Bicycle Boulevard	\$25,000	Project to be removed from the TIP and TAP funds reallocated to other qualifying trail projects
Rapid Rectangular Flashing Beacon (RRFB) at Old Cheney Rd and the Tierra-Williamsburg Trail	\$75,000	Funding allocated in 2022; in design phase with potential need for additional funding

### Planned Projects/Future Involvement

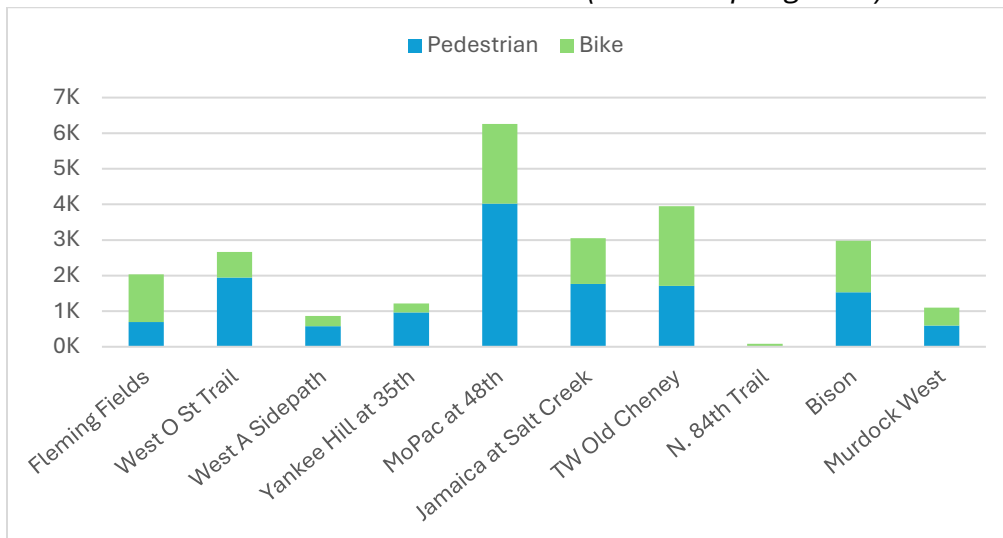
- Lincoln Vision Zero Action Plan – Several Complete Streets Committee members will serve on an Internal City Task Force identifying specific plan goal strategies and measures of effectiveness.
- 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) Update – The 5-year update of the LRTP will include a Project Oversight Planning Committee to guide development of the plan, comprised of a subset of the Lincoln MPO Technical Committee, whose membership overlaps with the Complete Streets Committee.
- Lincoln Mobility Plan – Like the LRTP Update above, the Project Oversight Planning Committee will guide development of the Lincoln Mobility Plan, providing particular insight on pedestrian and bicycle topics.
