

Southwest Subarea Detail










Lincoln Area Street & Roadway Improvements







Corridor Limits




Justification for No Interchange at Old Cheney Road



- Not Required to Provide Acceptable Levels of Service
- Insufficient Spacing between Warlick Boulevard and Old Cheney Road
- Safety/Railroad Conflicts
- Salt Creek Flood Plain Impacts
- Environmental Impacts to Wilderness Park

Old Cheney Road – Travel Time Difference






- Not Required to Provide Acceptable Operations








Old Cheney Road - Railroad Conflicts




