FHWA/FTA Approval of Amendment 2 to the Nebraska FY 2020-2024 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program

This letter is to inform you of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) review and approval of the highway and transit projects contained in Amendment 2 to the Nebraska Department of Transportation (NDOT) FY 2021 -2024 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). This amendment includes an amendment from the Lincoln MPO TIP, the Grand Island Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (GIAMPO) TIP and the Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council (SIMPCO) TIP, which are incorporated into Nebraska's STIP by reference. NDOT received one comment on the proposed Amendment 2 to FY 2021 – 2024 STIP during the public comment period and responded to that comment on December 22, 2020.

The Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization Official's Committee approved Amendment 1 to the Lincoln TIP on November 16, 2020. NDOT found Amendment 1 to the Lincoln TIP to be fiscally constrained and in accordance with the Lincoln public participation plan. NDOT approved Amendment 1 for inclusion into the NDOT STIP on November 25, 2020.

The Grand Island Area Metropolitan Planning Organization's (GIAMPO) Policy Board approved the Amendment 1 to the GIAMPO TIP on November 24, 2020. NDOT found Amendment 1 to the GIAMPO TIP to be fiscally constrained and in accordance with the GIAMPO public participation plan. NDOT approved Amendment 1 for inclusion into the NDOT STIP on December 7, 2020.

The Siouxland Interstate Metropolitan Planning Council (SIMPCO) Policy Board approved the Amendment 1 to the SIMPCO TIP on November 5, 2020. NDOT found Amendment 1 to the GIAMPO TIP to be fiscally constrained and in accordance with the SIMPCO public participation plan. NDOT approved Amendment 1 for inclusion into the NDOT STIP on December 16, 2020.

In accordance with 23 CFR Part 450.218(b) and 23 CFR Part 450.334(a), FHWA and FTA have determined that the highway and transit projects included in the Amendment 2 to the FY 2021-2024 STIP are based on a transportation planning process that substantially meets the requirements. Based on the FHWA review of the FY 2021 -2024 STIP, monitoring activities

throughout the year, the MPO's self-certifications, and the planning finding, Amendment 2 to FY 2021-2024 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) is hereby approved.

WHEREAS, the Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization (Lincoln MPO) is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) responsible for undertaking the transportation planning process for the Lincoln Metropolitan Transportation Management Area (TMA), in accordance with 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, and 23 CFR Part 450; and

WHEREAS, the Lincoln MPO, pursuant to 23 CFR 450.326, adopted on May 1, 2020 a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for federal Fiscal Years (FY) 2021 through 2024; and

WHEREAS, the Lincoln MPO has prepared an amendment to the MPO FY 2021-2024 TIP that makes changes to the projects as identified in Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the projects included in the amendment are consistent with the currently adopted MPO Long Range Transportation Plan, 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan - 2016 Update; and

WHEREAS, the amendment has been reviewed and recommended for adoption by the Technical Committee of the MPO, and now requires adoption from the Officials Committee of the MPO;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Lincoln Metropolitan Planning Organization Officials Committee adopts the amendment to the MPO FY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program.
