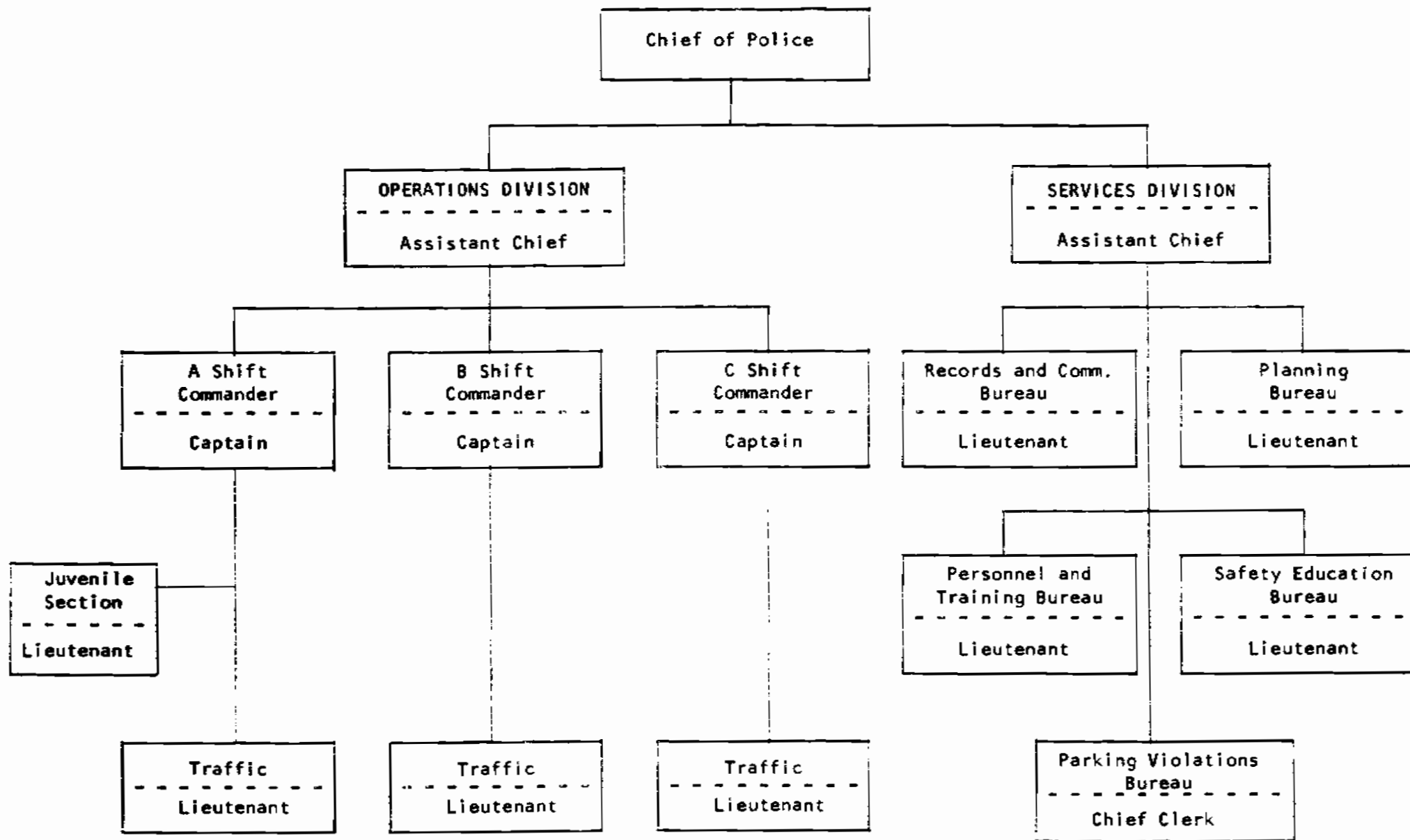

We submit herewith the report of the activities of the Lincoln Police Department for the year of 1963. This statistical data includes summarized information on the various phases of operation of the department, and provides a yardstick of measurement of the accomplishments of the City of Lincoln in both the crime and traffic fields.

The crime picture in Lincoln, Nebraska in the year of 1963 reflected the same spiralling trend upward which is a matter of grave concern over the entire nation. However, Lincoln's crime index of 2.9 per cent increase was considerably below the national average of 9.7 increase, as illustrated in the Crime Index Trend found in this report. It must be taken into consideration, in studying the increase in crime, that Lincoln's total area expanded from 25.94 square miles in May of 1962 to 34.8 square miles at the end of 1963, an increased coverage of 34.3% which is reflected in our crime reporting. Clearance rate of all offenses reported was 27.7%, with 27.1% of major crimes cleared by arrest.

Lincoln experienced a 54.5% drop in traffic fatalities during the year, from a total of 11 in 1962 to 5 in 1963. None of the fatal accidents involved more than one motor vehicle, with three motor vehicle-train collisions, one car-pedestrian accident, and one accident involving a car and a fixed object.

We take pride in the fact that the Lincoln Police Department was the recipient of an award from the International Association of Chiefs of Police for our achievements in Traffic Supervision for the year of 1963.

Total arrests declined 1.8% from 142,371 in 1962 to 139,900 in 1963, with 211 less persons jailed. Arrests for traffic moving violations were down 19.8% over 1962, total foreign parking tickets down .4%, and local parking arrests up 1%.

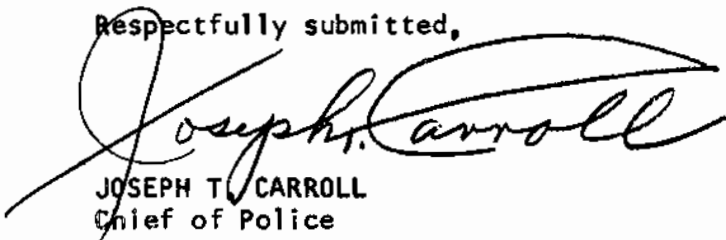
Juvenile contacts in 1962 dropped slightly from 2,033 in 1962 to a total of 2,001 in 1963, a 1.5% decrease. Of the 793 total offenses cleared during the year of 1963, 406 or 51% were cleared by the apprehension of juveniles under the age of 18, compared to 53% in 1962. Of the 274 major or more serious crimes which were cleared during the year, a total of 94 or 34% were cleared by the juvenile age group, a decline from 40% in 1962.

Demands from the public for police services continue to tax the manpower strength of the department, as is shown by the total complaints of all nature made to the department which, for the third consecutive year, totaled over 46,000.

The department in March of 1963 was authorized to make the change-over to a 5-day working week, with an additional 20 officers approved by the Council to provide adequate minimum manpower. Despite this improvement in working conditions, we experienced an 18% turnover in commissioned personnel as compared to a recommended 5% maximum annual turnover.

We would like to acknowledge our appreciation to the citizens of our fine city for their excellent cooperation, and to give recognition to you and your office, other city and governmental officials, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and other law enforcement agencies, the news media, and the business firms and civic groups of our city who contribute so much to the total program of this department. With this continued support and cooperation, this department will continue to maintain a high standing among the police departments of the nation, and make further advancements in the law enforcement field.

Prior to 1946, records do not include the breakdown in all types of arrests, such as warrants served and, prior to 1944, a breakdown was not made of parking tickets to indicate whether issued to local or foreign violators.

During the year of 1941, the total number of traffic violations is exceptionally high for the reason that, during that year, a total of 1,224 violators were booked for brake and light inspection violations.

In the forepart of 1955, a new policy was established with reference to the serving of warrants, and all individuals who were served with a warrant were lodged in jail. On delinquent parking and moving violation tickets, a complaint is now filed in court and the violator notified to appear in court on a designated date, and the warrant not served as in the years prior to 1955; however, if the violator fails to appear in court as instructed, the warrant is then served and the violator is lodged in jail.

A more complete analysis of each type of arrest for the year of 1963 will be found elsewhere in this report.

REVIEW OF 1963 MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC FATALITIES

No. 1

MOTOR VEHICLE - TRAIN

Date: Sunday, February 10, 1963 at 11:54 P.M.

Location: No. 27th Street at CB&Q Railroad Tracks.

Killed: MELVIN G. HOBBS, age 47, 20477 Pilgrim, Detroit, Michigan.

Mr. Hobbs was driving a southbound 1957 Mack tractor truck and trailer and stopped the vehicle on the railroad tracks. Witnesses state that he apparently had attempted to back off of the crossing but was unable to do so because another vehicle had stopped right at the rear of the truck and was unable to back up because the crossing gate had come down behind this second vehicle. A CB&Q railroad train, whose engineer was Harry R. Howard, age 39, of 228 South 17th Street, which was traveling westbound at a speed of 79 miles per hour, struck the truck, resulting in fatal injuries to Mr. Hobbs.

No. 2

MOTOR VEHICLE - TRAIN

Date: Saturday, March 2, 1963 at 10:04 P.M.

Location: Park Blvd. and Union Pacific Railroad Tracks.

Killed: LAWRENCE G. THOMAS, age 44, 1845 O Street.

The 1961 Studebaker sedan, driven by Mr. Thomas, was traveling northeast on Park Blvd. and struck the second unit of a Union Pacific train traveling south at approximately 25 miles per hour. The engineer of the train, Harold F. Klope, age 56, of 2003 High, Beatrice, Nebraska, stated that he saw the vehicle approaching the tracks at a fast speed. The engineer applied the emergency air and stopped the train 560 feet south of the crossing. The injuries to Mr. Thomas resulted in his death. The railroad crossing signals at this crossing had recently been installed but were not yet in operation. The streets were wet at the time of this accident.

No. 3

MOTOR VEHICLE - TRAIN

Date: Monday, September 9, 1963 at 4:42 P.M.

Location: 66th Street bet. Colfax and Seward, at the Rock Island Tracks.

Killed: LAURA M. LAMBERT, age 36, 3040 No. 68th Street.

Mrs. Lambert was driving a 1962 Chevrolet sedan north on 66th Street and failed to stop for the stop sign at this crossing and was struck by an eastbound Rock Island train traveling at approximately 30 miles per hour, engineered by Don Sleight, age 36, of Fairbury, Nebraska. Witnesses stated that the engineer of

the train had been blowing the horn more than normal as the train approached 66th Street as a warning to some children who were playing near the tracks. These witnesses stated that the driver of the car had looked only to the east and did not stop for the stop sign, driving onto the tracks directly into the path of the oncoming train. The car was carried 546 feet east of the crossing by the impact. The victim suffered fatal head injuries.

No. 4

MOTOR VEHICLE - FIXED OBJECT

Date: Friday, September 20, 1963 at 12:31 A.M.

Location: 70th between Kearney and Seward.

Killed: CLAUDE LEROY WALTER, age 21, 931 Mahoney Drive.

Mr. Walton was a passenger in a 1963 Corvair which was traveling south on 70th Street, driven by James A. Donaldson III, age 21, 6801 Benton. This vehicle passed another vehicle at the intersection of 70th and Kearney and was apparently exceeding the speed limit. When the driver attempted to return to his lane of traffic, he lost control of the vehicle and the vehicle continued over the curb on the west side of 70th and wrapped around a tree 78 feet south of Kearney Avenue. The driver and the passenger were both pinned in the car, the passenger receiving fatal injuries. The driver was hospitalized with multiple injuries to his face and chest. Both young men had been drinking prior to the time of the accident.

Location: 14th Street between Saunders and Virginia.

Killed: JENNIE MAY DAUGHERTY, age 82, 967 Nance Street.

Mrs. Daugherty was walking south on 14th Street when she was struck by a vehicle driven by Kenneth D. Waller, age 36, Route #6. It was dark and the street was wet from thawing snow. It is believed that Mrs. Daugherty had been walking south on the sidewalk of the Oak Creek bridge and that she then stepped into the street at the point where the sidewalk ended, possibly stepping around a puddle, when she was struck by the vehicle, and apparently died instantly from the injuries suffered in this accident.

SUMMARY OF THE 1963 TRAFFIC FATALITIES:

There were a total of five fatal traffic accidents during the year of 1963, each claiming one victim. Each of the accidents involved only one motor vehicle, three of them being in collision with trains, one with a pedestrian, and the third a fixed-object accident.

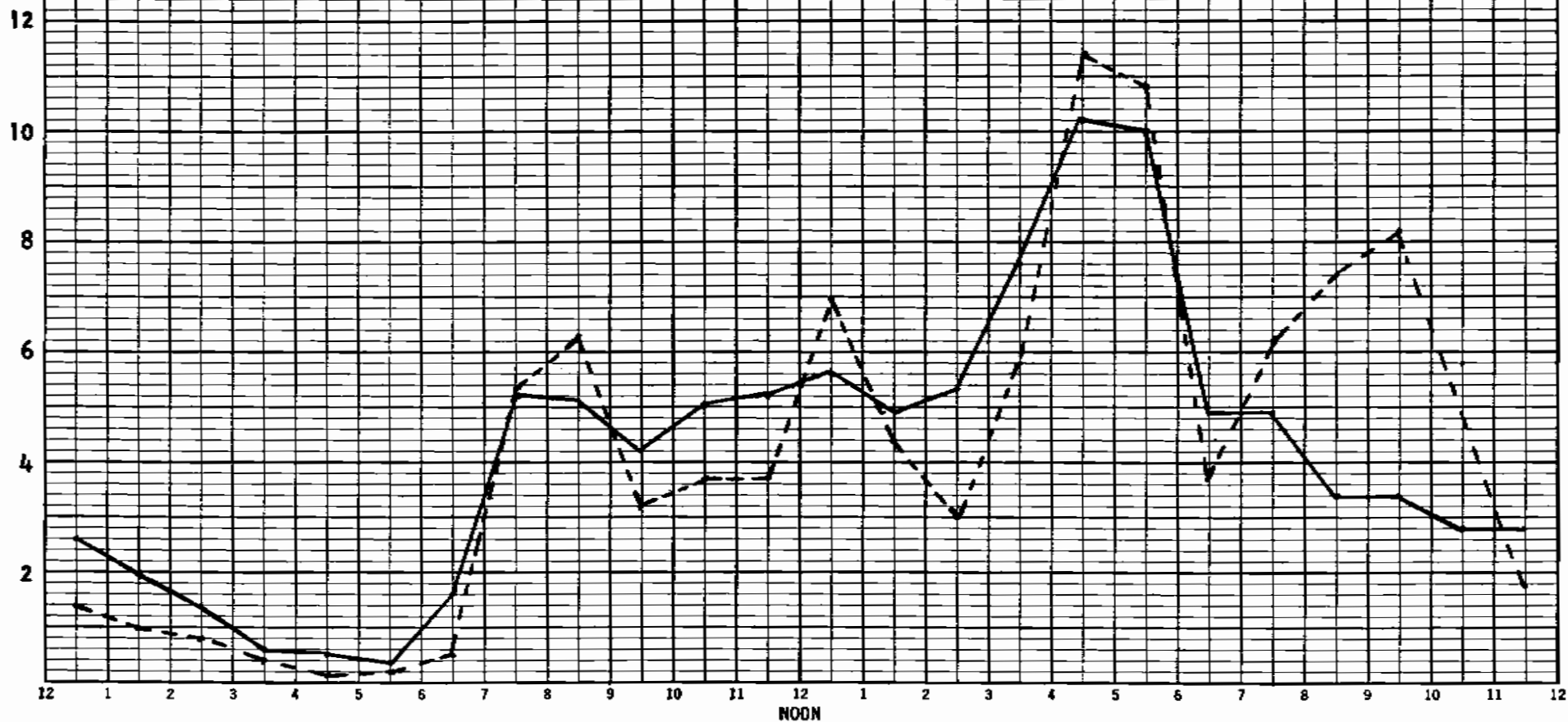

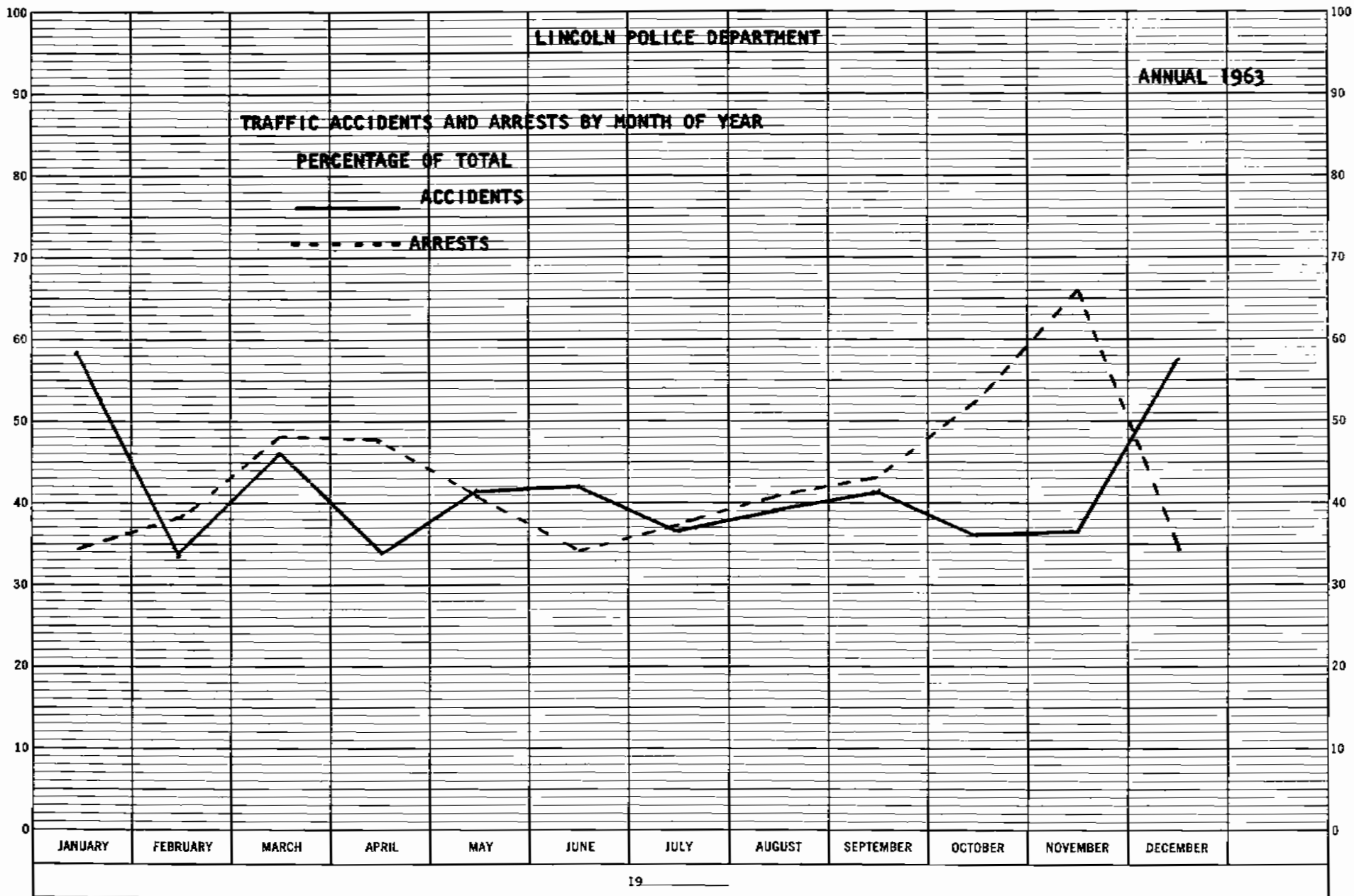
TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS AND ARRESTS BY HOUR OF DAY

To discourage those violators who fail to make disposition of their parking violation tickets until they have received letters of reminder from this department, a policy was inaugurated in 1950 which provides that a parking violator shall pay a one-dollar penalty at the Violations Bureau if disposition is made within five days after issuance date of the ticket. After five days have elapsed, a two-dollar penalty is assessed for parking tickets. Seven days after date of issuance, if there is no disposition made of the ticket, a letter is sent to the owner of the vehicle as a reminder of the unpaid ticket. If no response is made to this warning, a warrant for court appearance is automatically issued 18 days after date of the ticket. Provisions were made in 1957 for the Violations Bureau to handle the disposition of tickets for "Interfering with the use of the street," with a five-dollar penalty assessed within the five-day period and a seven-dollar penalty after the five days have elapsed.
