Prior to 1946, records do not include a breakdown in all types of arrests, such as warrants served and, prior to 1944, a breakdown is not available of parking tickets to indicate whether issued to local or foreign violators.

During the year of 1941, the total number of traffic violations is exceptionally high for the reason that, during that year, a total of 1,224 violators were booked for brake and light inspection violations.

In the forepart of 1955, a new policy was established for the serving of warrants, and all individuals who were served with a warrant were lodged in jail. On delinquent parking and moving violation tickets, a complaint is now filed in court and the violator notified to appear in court on a designated date, and the warrant not served as in years prior to 1955. However, if the violator fails to appear in court as instructed, the warrant is then served and the violator is lodged in jail.

A more complete analysis of each type of arrest for the year of 1965 will be found elsewhere in this report.

REVIEW OF 1965 MOTOR VEHICLE TRAFFIC FATALITIES

NO. 1

MOTOR VEHICLE - FIXED OBJECT

Date: Friday, January 14, 1965 at 11:16 P.M.

Location: Holdrege between Grace and 33rd Streets.

Killed: PAUL W. THEEL JR., AGE 39, 324 South 16th Street.

Mr. Theel was driving east on Holdrege and appeared to lose control of his vehicle, driving over the curb on the south side of Holdrege just east of 32nd Street. Then his vehicle went in a northeasterly direction, crossing the center line, driving on the wrong side of the street and hitting a west-bound vehicle driven by Thomas J. Reimers, age 19, residing at 4013 Holdrege. This caused the Theel vehicle to veer back to the south curb of Holdrege again and it then bounced from the south curb back in a northeasterly direction across to the north curb of Holdrege where the vehicle left the roadway, running over a "No Parking" sign and into a tree. Mr. Theel was killed instantly. It was raining slowly and the streets were wet; there was considerable damage to both vehicles.

NO. 2

MOTOR VEHICLE - PEDESTRIAN

Date: Thursday, July 29, 1965 at 8:31 P.M.

Location: Cleveland between 42nd and 43rd Streets.

Killed: NORMA JEAN TUTTLE, age 6, of 240 South 28th Street.

Norma Jean had been riding on the Salvation Army bus driven by Robert S. Knapp of 1620 Whittier Street, which was westbound on Cleveland and had stopped across the street from 4227 Cleveland to let Norma Jean off. Norma Jean was visiting her grandfather who lived at 4227 Cleveland. As Norma Jean got off the bus, she ran around in front of the bus into the right front fender of a vehicle driven by Elmer L. Keefover of 4025 Cleveland, who had been following the bus. He had noticed that the bus was slowing down but did not think about it stopping to discharge a passenger so he proceeded to pass the bus. Norma Jean passed away at Bryan Memorial Hospital at 6:24 A.M. on July 30, 1965 of the injuries she received in this accident.

NO. 3

MOTOR VEHICLE - MOTOR VEHICLE

Date: Saturday, August 21, 1965 at 1:03 P.M.

Location: 14th and Adams Streets.

Killed: LARRY L. COSTER, age 17, 6810 Fairfax Street.

Larry was driving east on Adams, making a left turn to go north on 14th Street and, according to statements of witnesses and the driver of the other vehicle involved, violated the stop sign at 14th and Adams. George E. Berniklau, age 17, of Route #5, was the other driver involved and he was traveling south on 14th and was not injured in the accident. Dwane Johnson, age 12, of 6831 Walker, a passenger in the Coster vehicle, was also injured and taken to Bryan Memorial Hospital where his injuries proved not to be serious. Upon further investigation of the accident by the officer, it was found that the brakes on the Coster vehicle were not in good condition, and that the driver was aware of the defect. Larry Coster passed away at 9:35 P.M. on August 27, 1965 in Lincoln General Hospital of severe head injuries.

NO. 4

MOTOR VEHICLE - MOTOR VEHICLE

Date: Thursday, August 26, 1965 at 5:51 P.M.

Location: West O between Burlington and North 7th Avenue.

Killed: JESSE A. REED, age 64, of 2427 D Street.

Mr. Reed was driving north on Burlington, making a right turn to go east on O Street, when he pulled out in front of a vehicle eastbound on O Street driven by Thomas S. Royster III, age 19, of the 818th Hdqts. Sqdn. of the Lincoln Air Force Base. Mr. Royster did not see the Reed vehicle until just at impact. A witness driving in the inside lane behind Mr. Royster gave a statement that the Royster vehicle was not speeding as he had followed it for some time, and said that he did not see the Reed vehicle until after the impact. It is not known whether Mr. Reed stopped for the stop sign and then pulled out or whether he just glided through the stop sign, not seeing the Royster vehicle. Mr. Reed expired at 7:35 A.M. on August 28, 1965 at Lincoln General Hospital.

NO. 5

MOTOR VEHICLE - MOTOR VEHICLE

Date: Friday, October 22, 1965 at 2:44 P.M.

Location: 66th and Logan Streets.

Killed: FRED B. BRUMMER, age 23, 6720 Logan Street.

This was a right-angle collision between a vehicle driven by Mr. Brummer who was westbound on Logan, and a vehicle driven by Charles E. Clark, age 25, of 6413 Morrill, who was traveling northbound on 66th Street. Mr. Brummer drove past a "Yield the right of way" sign that was protecting 66th Street. The damage was very extensive to both vehicles. Mr. Clark was taken to Bryan Memorial Hospital, treated for a leg injury and released. Mr. Brummer was also taken to Bryan Hospital where he was pronounced "Dead on Arrival." This accident occurred on a corner where there is nothing to obstruct the view of either driver.

SUMMARY OF THE 1965 FATALITIES:

There were only five fatal motor vehicle accidents in 1965 which is a much-improved record over the previous year. During 1965, there was only one pedestrian killed.

In all five of the fatal accidents, we find that the little slogan "Look again" would fit very well. If each of us, drivers and pedestrians alike, and even passengers would just "look again," we would experience a reduction in our traffic accidents. We are glad we did not repeat the record of fatalities for 1964, but there is still room for improvement.

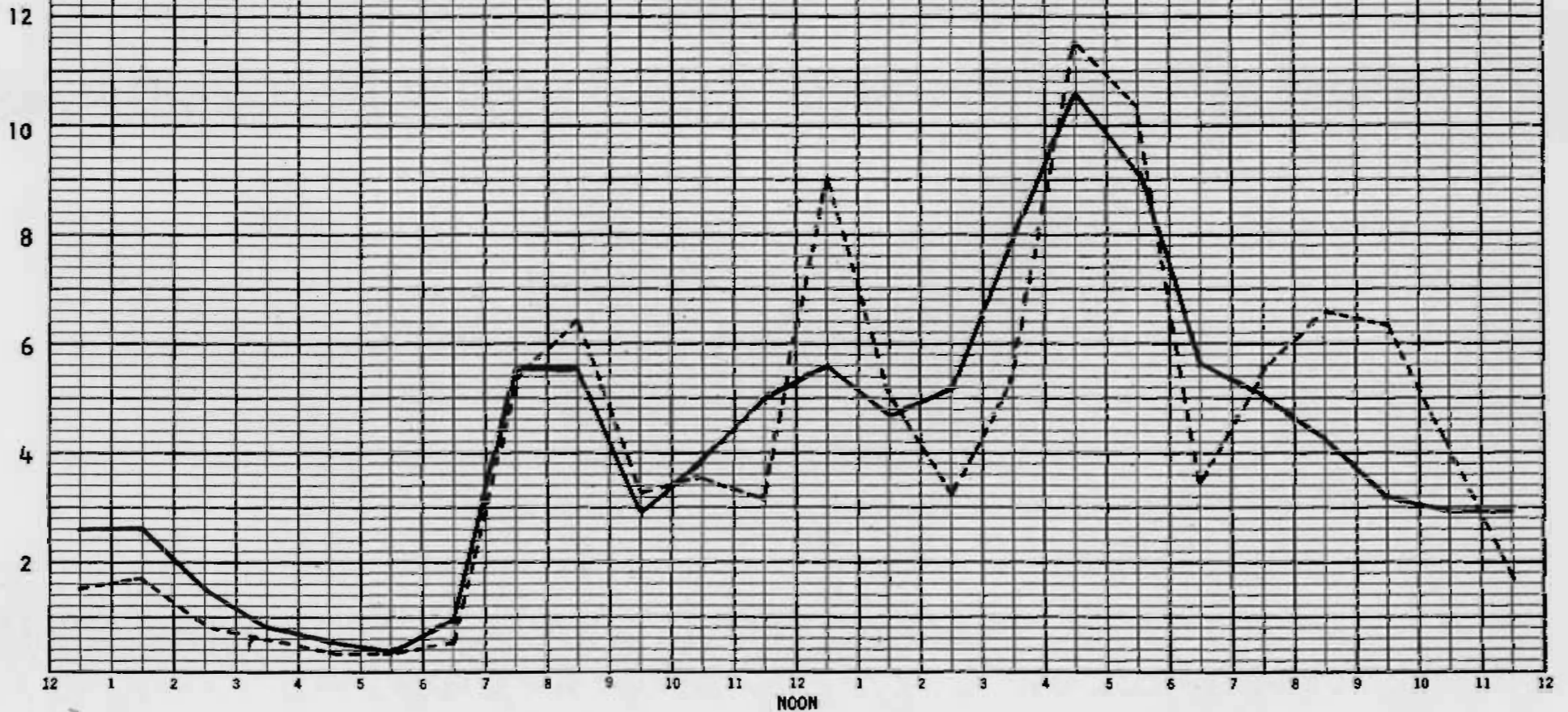

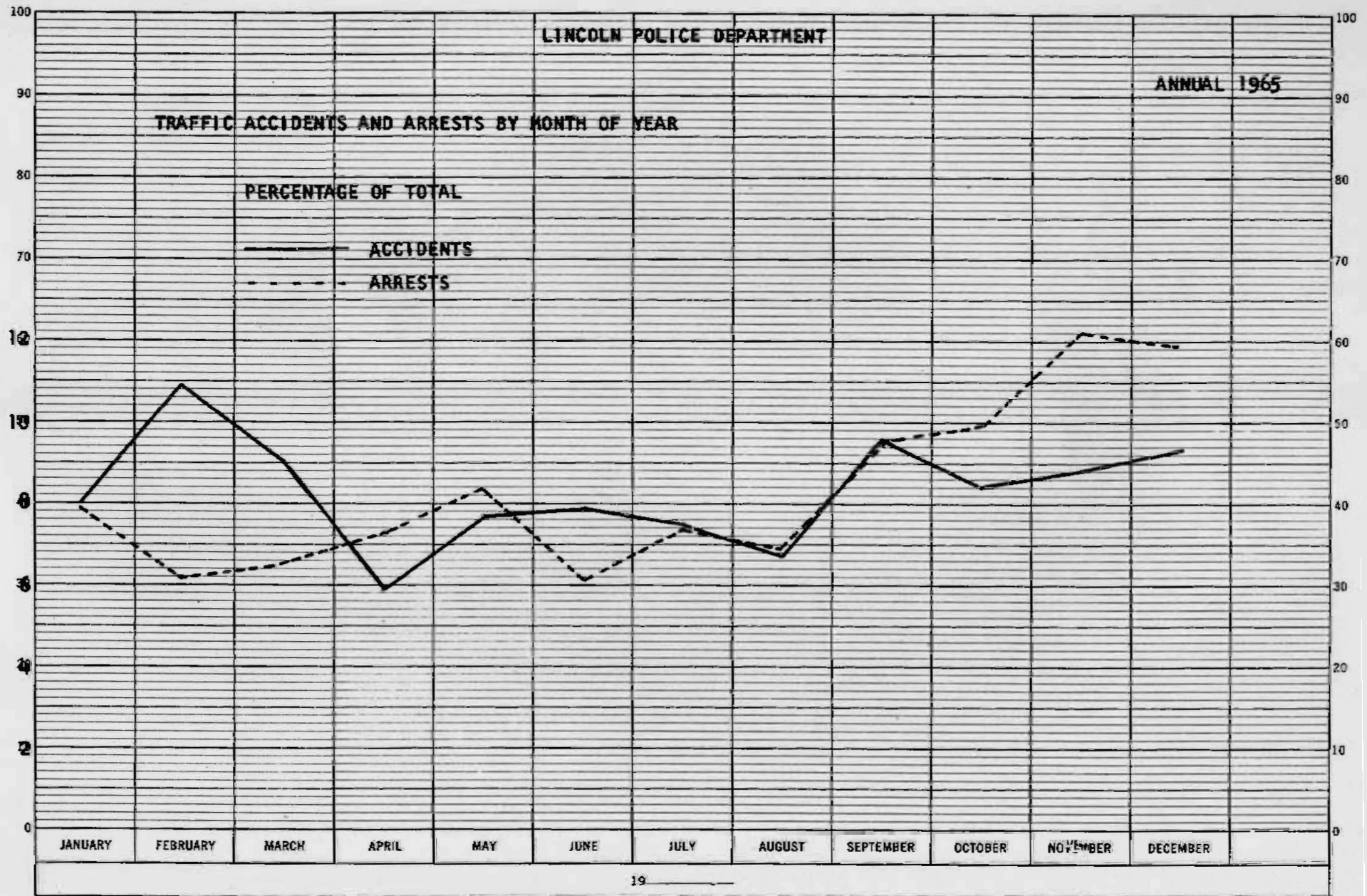

To discourage those violators who fail to make disposition of their parking violation tickets until they have received letters of reminder from this department, a policy was inaugurated in 1950 which provides that a parking violator shall pay a one-dollar penalty at the Violations Bureau if disposition is made within five days after issuance date of the ticket. After five days have elapsed, a two-dollar penalty is assessed for parking tickets. Seven days after date of issuance, if there is no disposition made of the ticket, a letter is sent to the owner of the vehicle as a reminder of the unpaid ticket. If no response is made to this warning, a warrant for court appearance is automatically issued 18 days after date of the ticket. Provisions were made in 1957 for the Violations Bureau to handle the disposition of tickets for "interfering with the use of the street" with a five-dollar penalty assessed within the five-day period and a seven-dollar penalty after the five days have elapsed.
