A use of control report is required anytime the level of control reaches Hard Empty Hand control or above. The level of control notated is the highest level of control that was utilized for apprehension of the subject. Officers will often have to move through a progression of control levels, which is dictated by the level of resistance presented by the subject and effectiveness of the control techniques.

A use of control report is required whenever there is a complaint of pain or injury, no matter how minor, by either the officer involved or the subject. Medical is required for any subject exposed to a taser deployment. Use of control reports are required and completed for each officer

involved in a qualifying incident, rather than per subject of the control. Therefore, statistical data regarding subject injury as a result of a use of control may be duplicated.
