2022 Second Quarter Incident Summaries and Case Review

Sgt Dittman and A/C Morrow reported on LPD's 2nd Quarter (April 1 to June 30, 2022) IA Case Review, Statistical Summary, Employee Incident Report Summary, and Employee Use of Control Summary. Of note:

- We have discussed the value of body worn cameras (BWC) for both external complaints and internal reviews of officer interactions, and it was asked if the media has been requesting the release of footage. It was confirmed that they have, and responses are being determined on a case-by-case basis.

- Positive observation that assaults on police officers, resisting arrest, and use of force incidents are down from 2020/2021 as are officer/suspect injuries. De-escalation training and subsequent utilization of those techniques are seemingly helpful; the use of BWC's likely contribute also.

- Internal affairs complaints are slightly escalated (10 total this quarter) but this is due to the addition of some internal initiated reviews and subsequent requests for investigations, which can result in teachable moments or discipline, as is appropriate.
- One IA complaint determined unfounded was related to a window tint violation, and it was asked over the last three years, how many racial profiling complaints have there been and what have the findings been. Sgt. Dittman indicated he can research and respond.
- There are currently five positions open for School Resource Officers.
- A/C Morrow distributed a **10 Year Review of Lincoln Police Department Employee Crashes** analysis for CPAB's information and review. It will be shared with all members and tabled for any questions or discussions at the next meeting.
- A CPAB report by Finnegan/Thompson with results from their hearing specific to a traffic citation will also be set for Old Business at the next meeting.
