Plan ahead and watch out for each other!

Tips to prevent package theft

- Most major delivery carriers allow special instructions for delivery. Check websites for details.
- Specify delivery to less obvious place (back door, behind bush, etc.) or specific delivery time
- Deliver to your place of employment (if allowed), a neighbor, an alternate location for pick up, or in store pick-up (usually a free option)
- Enable package tracking notifications
- Require signature for delivery
- Insure valuable items
- Consider video doorbell or other surveillance system
