Sidewalk space must be at least six feet wide.

Vouchers can be used to plant trees in front yards if the sidewalk space is too narrow.

Adopt an Ash Program



Allows residents to treat ash street trees.

Injection method by a licensed arborist.

Ideal time for treatment is late May and June.

Treatment should be done every two or three years.
