



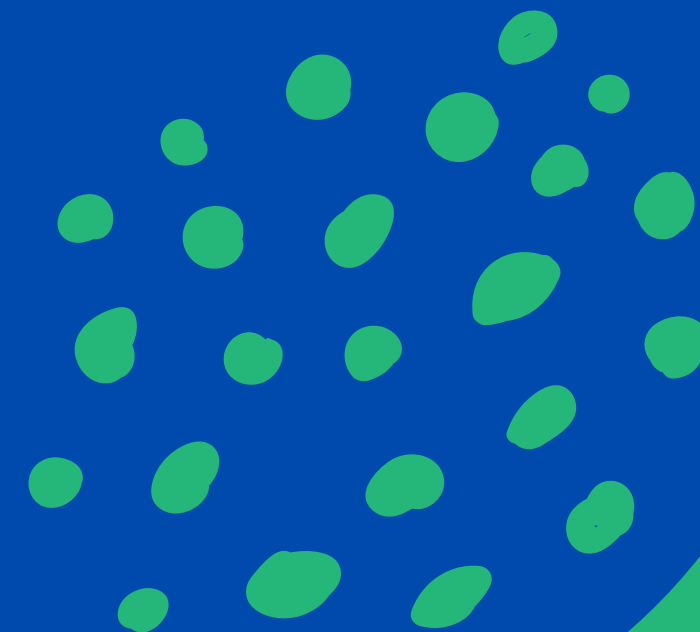

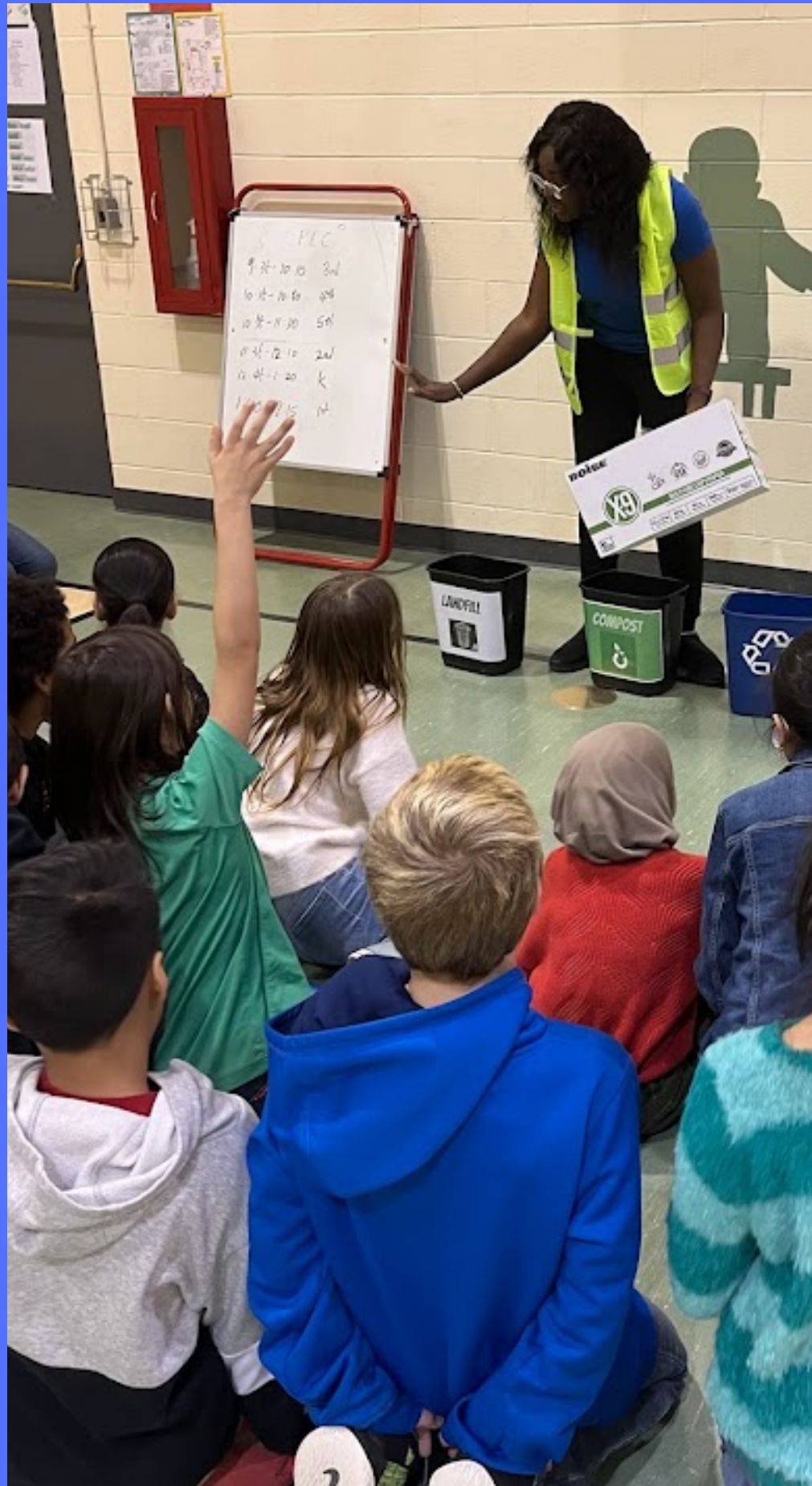

LITTER HAS EXTERNALIZED COSTS





EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE

Extended reach tool: Used to pick up litter off the ground or in hard to reach spaces. Available in children and adult sizes.



Gloves: Nitrile-coated work gloves. Available in children and adult sizes.



Safety Vests: Highly encouraged for all cleanup projects, particularly those along roadways or other areas with vehicle traffic.



Trash bags: 20-25 gallon sized, generally 1-2 bags per person is sufficient.



Bag ringers: Bungee cord secures ringer to bag and holds the bag open. Great for working in windy conditions.



GRANT FUNDING

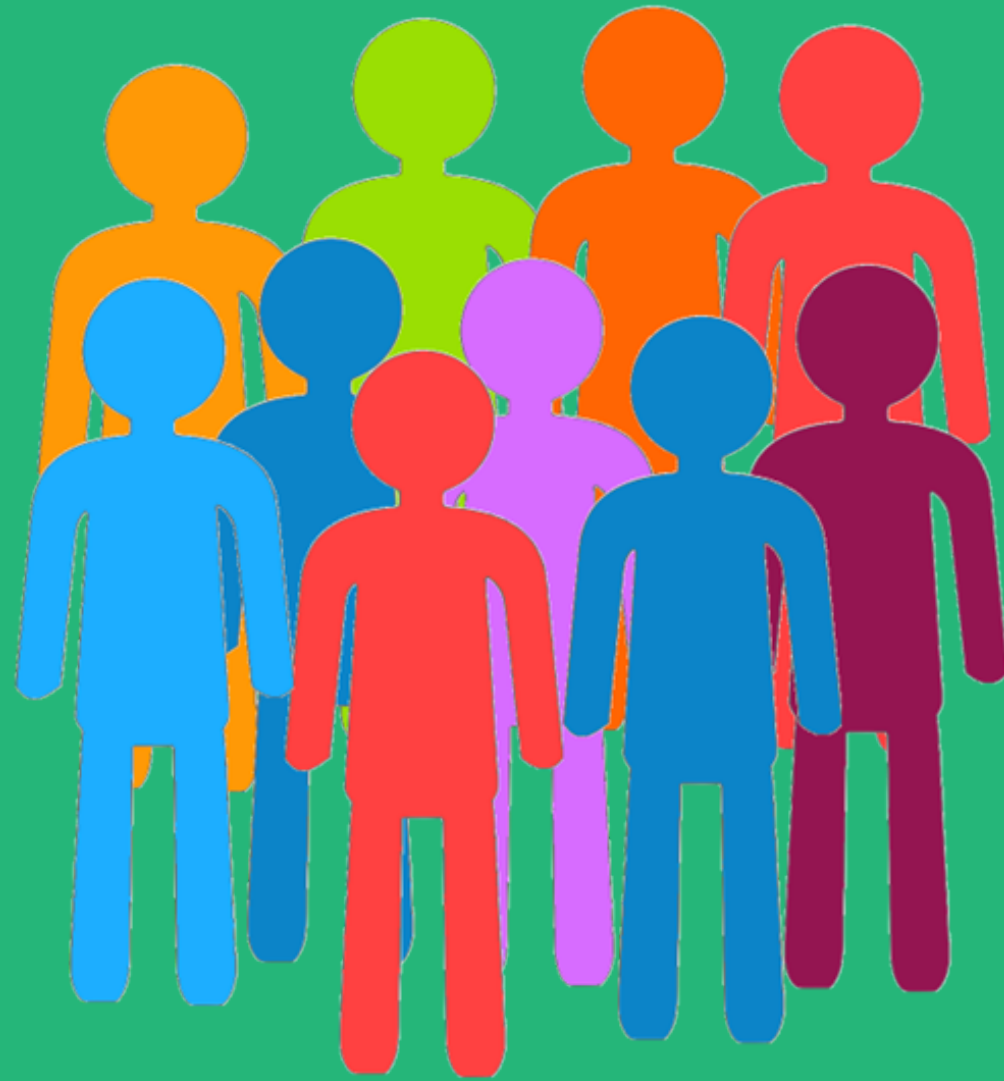


BEST PRACTICES

- receipts are required
- be mindful on spending limits (i.e. \$75 fuel, \$750 tire disposal, \$250 event promotion)

COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT GRANTS BEST PRACTICES

- Map the area you plan to do in advance
- Consider doing the same cleanup multiple times
- Grants are from NE Dept of Env. and Energy based on the exact area cleaned, so be mindful of landmarks as you go.
 - \$50/mile and \$10/acre or a combination
